# SUBMISSION TO GOVERNMENT 1 Peter 2:13-17

#### MONDAY

Prophet Project: Daniel 8:15-27

Today's passage gives us the interpretation of the vision, which concerns the future of the region. The vision is given to prepare God's people for upcoming events, including severe persecutions to come. Read Matthew 10:16-23. As Christ, sends out the twelve Apostles, He warns them that persecution will come and this is true for Christians today. For those who love Christ and seek to proclaim Him persecution will come. "And you will be hated by all for my name's sake" (Matt 10:22).

# TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Daniel 9:1-27

When it comes to the specifics of the end times, theories abound. There's no doubt that passages like today's are difficult to understand, yet it's helpful to focus on what is plain. Notice, for instance, God's purpose statement for the seventy weeks that are declared in verse 24. While there are multiple views on what these weeks are, the Lord is crystal clear about their purpose. While we may not understand everything about the end, we certainly look forward to the absence of sin and the bringing of everlasting righteousness. The next time you get caught up trying to discern the end, remember the Lord's purpose in bringing this world to that point.

Prophet Project: Daniel 10:1-21

"Then he said to me, 'Fear not, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand and humbled yourself before your God, your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words," (Dan 10:12). God was attentive to and answered Daniel's prayer. What a great encouragement this must have been from God. We know that God hears our prayers. Pray, the Lord gives you a heart that desires to understand His will and for a heart that is humble before Him.

# **THURSDAY**

Prophet Project: Daniel 11:1-45

"Daniel's vision in today's passage emphasizes the point that the exilic conditions of the old covenant community would continue once they were back in their land. The Jews would have to wait for their exaltation over the kingdoms of this world and the defeat of their enemies. We continue to wait for the exaltation of all of God's people, Jew and Gentile alike, and the defeat of our enemies. This end goal will surely be accomplished. Let us pray that the Lord will bring it soon." (Ligonier.org)

# Prophet Project: Daniel 12:1-13

While the books of Daniel and Revelation record many of the same events, there is an interesting difference between the instructions to Daniel and John. In our reading for today, Daniel is instructed to "shut up the words and seal the book... until the time of the end" (vv. 4, 9), while the Apostle John was instructed to "not seal up the words of the prophecy of this book, for the time is near" (Rev. 22:10). The difference between these two instructions is the atoning work of Christ. In Daniel's day, Jesus had not been crucified and resurrected, but in John's He had. This is a reminder to us that God's greatest goal is to save His people from their sins so that they might glorify Him, and that Christ's return is imminent. Therefore, we must be ready and seek to "turn many to righteousness" (v. 3).

#### SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 1:1-11

The Lord gives Hosea a command to marry. In doing so, it is foretold that his wife will be unfaithful. Her unfaithfulness to her husband serves as a metaphor of the unfaithfulness of Israel to the Lord, her husband. Marriage is used, throughout Scripture, as an illustration to help us to better understand the relationship between the Lord and His people, and between Christ and the church. Consider your relationship with the Lord. Are there areas of your life where you have been unfaithful? Pray and ask the Lord to reveal these to you. Confess and repent of any sin and ask the Lord to forgive you while also asking for help in remaining more faithful to the Lord.
