1 Peter 2:18-25

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 8:1-14

Israel's hypocrisy is evident in this passage. They claimed to know and to love the Lord, but their deeds proved otherwise. Are there areas of your life where this might be true of you? Ask the Lord to search your heart and reveal any areas of hypocrisy. Confess and repent of anything that is revealed to you.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 9:1-10:15

In another passage of the Lord's judgment upon His adulterous people, we see what matters most to God: our hearts. In 10:2, the Lord declares that Israel's hearts were false, and this was in the context of their nation's prosperity. As things got better, their hearts grew more corrupt and went after idols — what a lesson for us as we live in such a prosperous nation. The easier things are, the more we must be careful to guard our hearts and keep them fixed on Christ.



WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 11:1-12:1

In this passage, another family metaphor is used. The Lord has been portrayed as a husband and now also a father, and we see the love the Father has for His children. This passage is an endearing passage. We read of God pouring out His irrepressible love (v. 8). The relationship that God has, with His family, is not to be viewed as a formality. Here we see that the Lord, in His outpouring of emotion, is demonstrating that He is filled with compassion, in contrast to the lifeless Baal. Our God is loving. May we always be thankful for our God who loves and has mercy and compassion.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 13:1-16

While it seems desirable and comfortable, prosperity is a dangerous thing. Notice verse 6 of today's reading. The Lord richly provided for His people, and because they were "filled" or content, their hearts wandered after other gods. We must always remember that we are not here to build our own kingdoms but to make disciples until the Lord brings His kingdom. Determine today to never let the world's goods distract you from that most important mission.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 12:2-14

Hosea puts on display and recounts past indictments on Israel. He does this to display the Lord's enduring kindness to them and their stubborn ingratitude. We too can be stubborn and show ingratitude even though we know that God's kindness endures. His mercies are new every morning (Lam. 3:23). May God's love for us always be at the forefront of our thoughts. May we stop any ingratitude, in our hearts, and be ever thankful for what He has done for us.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Hosea 14:1-9

As this book comes to a close Hosea does so with a series of appeals to the northern kingdom. The northern kingdom was wayward, and these moving appeals are for them to return to the Lord for healing and covenantal renewal. The Lord is patient, loving, and merciful. Take time today and the next few days to specifically thank Him for His patience, love, and mercy in your life.
