MONDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 1:1-12

The prophet is describing the contemporary day of the Lord. The locust plague and drought caused suffering and devastation. In today's passage we read the details of the destruction. In verse 2 we read "Hear this," and "give ear." There is an emphasis placed on giving undivided attention and focus on what was said as it was that serious. Consider your time in God's word. "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness," (2 Tim 3:16). Does that not demand that you give it your undivided attention and focus?

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 1:13-20

When disaster strikes, it is common for many people to respond to the crisis by taking action. Here in our reading for today disaster had struck and the Lord called the people to respond to the crisis. What was the specific way in which they were to respond? We find our answer at the end of verse 14; the people were to cry out to the Lord in prayer. All too often we talk about prayer as if it's not enough. We say things like, "We can pray, but we also need to do something about it." May the Lord forgive us for such a lack of faith and may we be a people who are devoted to prayer.

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 2:1-11

Today's passage describes the coming of a great army, the arrival of the Day of the Lord. The arrival of this army may be averted by a wholehearted return to the Lord (see tomorrow's passage). This army is steadfast in its assigned course, "they do not swerve," and "they do not jostle" (vv. 7-8). This army is described as "a powerful army drawn up for battle" (v. 5). Knowing of such an army should not be taken lightly. The imagery used by Joel is used as an intense call to repent in light of what is to come. In light of what's to come, consider those in your life who need to hear the gospel and repent of their sin. Pray for them and pray for opportunities to share Christ with them.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 2:18-27

Sin brings with it consequences. It blinds us and makes life tremendously difficult as the Lord disciplines us for our own good. Sometimes we are tempted to look back on a past life of sin and think that God would or could never use us. Here, in verse 25, we find such sweet words of encouragement. The Lord restores even the worst of us when He saves us. No one can ever out-sin the grace of God, and no sinner is beyond God's restoration.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 2:12-17

Yesterday's passage described the coming of a great army, whose coming might be averted by a return to the Lord. Today we see that call to "return to the Lord your God" because "he is gracious and merciful, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster," (v. 13). It is not known if He will turn and relent "and leave a blessing behind him" (v. 14). However, the language here does leave open the possibility that God, in keeping with His revealed character, will bring blessing instead of disaster. God declares "return to me with all your heart" (V. 12). Our God is loving and merciful. His love is steadfast and abounding. No matter the trial or the sin, in your life, return to God with all your heart, trusting in Him fully.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 2:28-32

"And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved. For in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there shall be those who escape, as the Lord has said, and among the survivors shall be those whom the Lord calls" (Joel 2:32). Does this verse sound familiar? Paul quotes this verse in his letter to the Romans (10:13). The God of the Old Testament is the God of the New Testament. His character is unchanging. Praise Him knowing that because He is unchangeable, He can always be trusted, is faithful, and we are secure in Him through Christ.
