MONDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 3:1-16

"I will gather all the nations and bring them down to the Valley of Jehoshaphat. And I will enter into judgment with them there, on behalf of my people and my heritage Israel, because they have scattered them among the nations and have divided up my land," (Joel 3:2). "All the nations," or in other words all of those who have oppressed God's people. God will judge those who have oppressed and have wronged His people. He has not and will not forget. Knowing this truly is a comfort for the child of God. We do not have to worry about what will happen to our enemies, who are ultimately enemies of God, as He is the righteous Judge.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Joel 3:17-21

As Christians, we know the full story of what God's plan for the world is. We know that suffering is normal in a fallen world, but that one day, the Lord Jesus will return to right all wrongs and end all suffering. As you wade through the difficulties of life right now, let today's reading be a sweet reminder to you that you are not home, but Jesus is taking you there.



Wednesday

Prophet Project: Amos 1:1-2:3

"And he said: 'The Lord roars from Zion and utters his voice from Jerusalem; the pastures of the shepherds mourn, and the top of Carmel withers," (Amos 1:2). Even though at the time, Israel rejected Jerusalem, it was the only appropriate place of worship. It was still the place from which God's voice of judgment was issued to all the earth. There is a reminder here that "Carmel withers," which demonstrated that He alone is the true God. Our God is the true God and alone is worthy of our worship and praise. Pray and ask the Lord to reveal anything in your life, which may be an idol, which would take away from your worship of the Him the true God.

Prophet Project: Amos 2:6-16

FRIDAY

In today's reading, Israel's sin is described and weighed against all that the Lord had done for them. It is easy to read about Israel's sin and wonder why they would ever make such poor decisions. Yet, we must put the same question to ourselves. In light of all that the Lord has done for us, how could we continue to sin? Spend some time in prayer, asking the Lord to increase your understanding of His gracious actions toward you so that you might be better equipped to fight sin.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Amos 2:4-5

Judah, who had sworn a blood oath to keep "the law of the Lord," is not judged like the other nations. Other nations were judged for their inhumanity. Judah was to be judged according to a much higher standard, the law. There was judgment because they had sinned against the law of God. The Bible tells us that the law is written on the heart and conscience (Rom 2:14-15). We are reminded here that He has chosen us to proclaim Christ, to bring to light the need to be forgiven for breaking God's law. Pray and ask the Lord for opportunities to proclaim Christ to the world.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Amos 3:1-4:5

In today's passage, God is warning Israel, through Amos, that judgment is coming. Israel is to be judged for their sin, although those sins are not detailed here. Amos likens this to the roar of a lion just as he pounces on its prey. God's righteous judgment, over sin, is not to be taken lightly. As a Christian, you are forgiven of your sin, and will not face the wrath of God's judgment because of Christ's sacrifice on your behalf. However, this does not mean that God is alright with or is pleased when we sin. Remember Romans 6:15: "What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means!" Although forgiven, we will still have to give an account. "So then each of us will give an account of himself to God" (Romans 14:12).
