THE SON OF GOD ON THE MOVE Mark 1:9-15

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 7:1-20

We are professionals at seeing other people's sins. It seems that our senses are keenly developed to point out the flaws in others. In Matt 7:1-5, Jesus gives us some practical help here. Each time we see the sin of another, we ought to take a moment to reflect on how that sin may be manifesting itself in our own life and heart. Oh, how often we would be humbled, helped, and strengthened if we would spend as much time diagnosing our own sin. And how greatly we would be able to help others if we came to them as a fellow teammate rather than a referee.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 7:21-29

Perhaps you have never read this passage before. Perhaps you have read it and heard it a hundred times over in your decades of walking with the Lord. Either way, these words ought to cause you to sit back and reflect: Jesus says that many people — many — will arrive before him after they die only to find out that while they thought they were his people, they are not. Many people who do many things for him are not his. He warns that the distinction will come down to this: what we do with what he says. Read this passage like your life depends on it.

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 8:1-17

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 9:1-17

Jesus healed many of sickness and also those oppressed by demons. "This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah: 'He took our illnesses and bore our diseases'" (Matt 8:17). The prophecy, from Isaiah 53, focuses directly on Jesus's messianic role as healer. Scripture is showing us another proof that Jesus is who He says He is. Praise the Lord for all that is written in the Bible that points to and affirms Jesus as our Savior. Thank Him for the blessed assurance we have in Christ. Jesus healed the paralytic of his physical problem, but first, He told the paralytic that his sins were forgiven. Why? Of the two problems, the problem of sin was the more fundamental problem. Jesus forgave the man, of his sin, because Jesus, "saw their faith" (v. 2). Jesus then healed the man of His physical ailment to show that they would "know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." Jesus knew the problems that the paralytic man had. Jesus also knew which problem was greater. We see and know of unbelievers who have physical needs and we want to help, which is a very good thing. We must also recognize that those who are without Christ have a greater need, and that need is Christ.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 8:18-34

The scribe said that he would follow Jesus wherever He went, but first, he wanted to bury his father who wasn't even dead yet. In other words, the man wanted to receive his inheritance before following Jesus. "And Jesus said to him, 'Follow me, and leave the dead to bury their own dead'" (Matt 8:22). Jesus was telling this man to follow Him and leave the world, the spiritually dead, to care for such things. We are called to follow Jesus. However, this passage reminds us that there is a cost to following Jesus. The cost involves more than an inconvenience, or a loss of inheritance; it involves suffering.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 9:18-31

A woman had suffered from a discharge of blood for twelve years. After she was healed, Jesus said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well" (v. 21). A few verses later, we read of Jesus, healing two blind men. After this Jesus said to them, "according to your faith be it done to you" (v. 29). The woman believed that just by touching His garment, she would be made well. Jesus asked the two men if they believed that He could heal them and they responded, yes. These three people believed in Jesus and had faith in Him. Faith itself does not do healing, whether physical or spiritual; God does. Their faith was a divine means for their bodily healing, but also, and more importantly, spiritual salvation.
