# WHAT KIND OF HEALER IS THIS? Mark 1:29-34

## MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 13:47-58

People were constantly astonished by Jesus, except in his hometown (Mt 13:54). The people who knew him closest took offense at him. When we read this story, we want to put ourselves in Jesus' shoes. "I won't let those who are closest to me look down on what I am trying to do for God." OK. But let's also ask if we are ever in the people's shoes. When those who are closest to us attempt great things for Christ and his church, let us not be the ones to discourage them simply because they are so common and familiar to us. Let us trust in the power of a God who can use a man from Nazareth to save the world.

# TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 14:1-21

Sometimes, even when with great obedience, we do all that Lord has called us to do, it doesn't immediately appear to be a happy result. Consider Job. Consider the prophet Jeremiah. Consider Matthew 14:1-12 and the gruesome end to the life of John the Baptist. Through a series of strange and unpredictable circumstances, he is decapitated and his head is carried around on a platter like a sick joke. We do not obey God because he is our genie, granting our wishes in return for our performance. We obey the Lord because he is worthy of it, and as the sovereign king over all deserves our lifelong allegiance. We obey him because he is right and true. We obey him because he has adopted us as his own children. In the end, all will be well in heaven, but there will be many things on this earth that remain broken.

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 14:22-36

Today's passage focuses on one of the most famous scenes in the Bible. After feeding five thousand people, Jesus sends His disciples out on the water while He took time to pray. This sets the scene for Peter to exercise his faith and walk on water. We can learn many lessons about faith in the midst of trials or God's sovereignty over the events in our lives. But Matthew's purpose in recording this account centers on Jesus' identity. After Peter and Jesus return to the boat, the audience sees a far greater scene. The disciples make an amazing claim, albeit misunderstood. They worship Him as "the Son of God." While the disciples worship because of what they had seen, we worship by what we read in His Word. Drink deeply from the Word of life and allow that to fuel true worship of Jesus Christ, the Son of God!

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 15:1-20

After the Babylonian captivity, the Jewish people instituted "extra-biblical commands." The religious leaders had added extra "commands" to the Law in an attempt to prevent anyone from actually breaking them. Their intention is commendable but misguided. The problem was that they held their own "commands" higher than God's commands. Jesus mercifully and graciously highlights the error of their ways and shows them that their precautions had given way for the corrupt human heart to rebel against God. While we don't have this same oral tradition, we do have standards, preferences, and opinions. Are these fueling obedience to God and love for the body? Or, have these become pathways to rebel against God?

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 15:21-31

God planned to first bring salvation to His chosen Israel and then to the Gentiles. However, He responds to all who would call on Him in true faith. Here this Canaanite woman, a non-Jewish pagan living in the region, had an attitude of humble faith. The result was that Jesus' healing ministry operated in the healing of her daughter.

## SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 15:32-39

"And Jesus said to them, 'How many loaves do you have?' They said, 'Seven, and a few small fish'" (Matt 15:34). The number seven is symbolic of completion. The number seven, in this passage, may be symbolic of God's provision for all people, now including the Gentiles. As Israel rejects the kingdom, the Gentiles increasingly come into view. As we consider how Jesus provided, when He feeds the four thousand, we are reminded that He provides for our needs. "And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (Phil 4:19).
