WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 21:1-17

The Jesus of the Bible is not simply a meek and mild man who spread a message of only love. Instead, our passage shows a man who is burning with righteous indignation and zealous for God's glory. In today's passage, Jesus drives out those who were buying and selling in the temple. They had made God's temple into "a den of robbers." Instead of looking the other way or speaking about their sin, Jesus actively drives these people out of the temple. His passion and zeal for God's glory motivated Him to action. The question we need to ask ourselves is simply this: does my passion and zeal for God's glory motivate me for action?

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 21:18-27

Our passage begins with what appears to be an odd account. Jesus Curses a fig tree that should have had fruit, and it immediately withered. This whole account is not a scene of frustration but an intentional act. Israel, like the fig tree, was spiritually fruitless and would eventually reject the promised messiah. His cursing of the fig tree is a symbolic action intended for the nation of Israel. Now, before we begin to look down on Israel for their lack of spiritual fruit, examine your own life. Is there fruitfulness in your life or only the appearance of fruit?

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 21:28-46

The actions of a person are what prove if they are obedient to God. The Parable of the Two Sons contrasts one son who said he would not do what his father asked and then did, with the other who said he would do what his father asked but did not. Only one of them did the will of his father. It is the fruit of one's life that will ultimately prove whether or not they are obedient to God.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 22:1-33

There are matters that belong to the realm of God and matters that belong to the realm of civil government. Jesus did not come to establish a kingdom that was in opposition to Caesar. When Jesus states to "render to Caesar that things that are Caesar's" (v. 21a) He is telling His followers that they should pay taxes and obey laws. We are also to render "to God the things that are God's" (v. 21b). Rendering to each as we ought is a reminder to not too closely align the church and government so as not to compromise the church. The goal is to honor God by obeying civil law, without compromising our honoring and obedience to Him.
