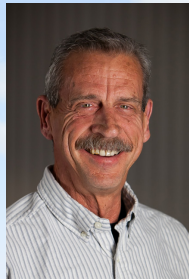

THE POWER AND PRIORITY OF JESUS' MINISTRY

Mark 1:35-39

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 16:1-12

The Pharisees and Sadducees were opponents who worked together against Jesus. They came to Jesus, not out of need or genuine faith, but to test Him. They were demanding a sign or a miracle to use against Him. Both saw Jesus as a threat to their places of leadership and power. The one who came to save was considered a threat. Someone today might consider Jesus to be a threat to them as well. There is a cost to following Jesus and that cost may be a position of leadership, power, or financial gain and more. However, for those who have been saved, by His sacrifice on the cross, know that the cost is worth it.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 16:13-20

“Simon Peter replied, ‘You are the Christ, the Son of the living God’ (Matt. 16:16). Christ, the Messiah, the Anointed One, is the Son of the God who is alive. The Son of the living God! This is completely unlike the pagan gods of Caesarea Philippi. The God of the Bible is not dead, but alive and His Son is unique. Praise the Lord for who He is and that He is not like the pagan gods. Praise the Son for He is the Christ, the fulfillment of the Old Testament promise!

WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 16:21-28

In today's passage, we not only read of Jesus foretelling His death and resurrection (vv. 21-23), but also Christ revealing the cost of discipleship (vv. 24-28). Focus on verse 24. "Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.'" Jesus uses crucifixion as a shocking metaphor for discipleship. A disciple of Christ must deny themselves, which means to die to their self-will, and take up his cross, which is the embracing of God's will no matter the cost. This is what it means to follow Christ.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 17:1-13

In the transfiguration, Jesus reveals His divine glory. Christ's physical transformation is a reminder of the glory He had, which He set aside when He became man and a preview of His future exaltation. The appearance of Moses and Elijah are representations of the Law and the Prophets, both of which witness to Jesus as the Messiah as the one who fulfills the Old Testament.

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 17:14-21

Jesus heals a boy with a demon and in Jesus' response to the disciples, He uses the common Jewish metaphor of moving a mountain, for doing that which is seemingly impossible. "He said to them, 'Because of your little faith. For truly, I say to you, if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move, and nothing will be impossible for you'" (Matt 17:20). It wasn't that the disciples didn't have any faith, or that they were devoid of faith; it was that their faith was not functioning properly. As we know faith, at times, can be stronger or weaker. Our desire ought to be that our faith is strong in the Lord. Pray and ask the Lord to give you greater, stronger faith in Him.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 17:22-27

As Jesus foretells His death and resurrection, for a second time, He adds additional detail. Not only will Jesus be handed over to His enemies, but also that He will be betrayed. This is what He means when He says, "the Son of Man is about to be delivered" (v. 22). One of them will betray and deliver Him over to His enemies. We read of this knowing what's to come. We know the how and the who of Jesus' betrayal. His disciples, however, did not. The end of verse 23 tells us that "they were greatly distressed." Where our focus needs to be is on what Christ says, "and he will be raised on the third day." Jesus was betrayed into the hands of the enemies and they put Him to death on the cross. Christ died for our transgressions and He "was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father," so that "we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4).
