QUESTIONING JESUS' DEVOTION Mark 2:18-22

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 1:1-15

As John the Baptist prepares the way, he calls for people to repent. He calls them to turn away from sin and turn to God for forgiveness. Repentance must come before baptism because baptism is not the means of the forgiveness of sins. Baptism is the sign that that one has truly repented. We live in a time of easy believism, where anyone can "go to heaven" by merely believing in Jesus, but there has been no true confession and repentance of sin. Believers are called to evangelize the lost, to preach to them the true gospel of Christ. Pray for those you tell about Christ. Pray that there would be true repentance of sin and turning to God for forgiveness.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 1:16-28

When Jesus calls His first disciples, He calls them to "become fishers of men" (v. 17). To be a fisher of men was to call people back from idols to God. This call includes both Jew and Gentile. We, too, are called to be fishers of men. We also are to call people to God. To be a good fisherman requires patience and the right equipment. To be a fisher of men requires the same. Equip yourself to be ready to proclaim the gospel and be patient with others as God has been patient with you.

WELCOME

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 1:29-45

Today's passage focuses on the result of Jesus' fame. After casting out a demon, Jesus becomes wildly popular, and people flock to him in hopes of receiving relief from their pain and suffering. The whole city was gathered at his door, and Jesus spent what would have been hours healing them. Think about the mental, emotional, and physical toll this must have been. But instead of taking a much-needed break or sleeping in, we see Jesus "rising very early in the morning...and praying" (v.35). Don't rush over this point. The God-Man, Jesus Christ, prays to His Father. If anyone could have skipped prayer, surely it would have been Jesus. We should prioritize prayer as Jesus does.

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 2:13-28

FRIDAY

The Pharisees considered the plucking of grain as unlawful because the rubbing of grains in hand was considered threshing and had been forbidden on the Sabbath. What was forbidden was the reaping of profit on the Sabbath (Ex. 34:21). The disciples were not threshing to make money but to eat. The Pharisees were calling this action of the disciples, sinful when they were the ones in sin. By charging this act as sinful, they were placing their tradition at the same level as God's law. We, too, can easily place a personal conviction at the same level of what the Lord commands. Pray and ask the Lord to reveal any area of your life, where you might look at another as if they've sinned when they have not sinned at all.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 2:1-12

We come to a familiar passage that centers on a paralytic and his friends. Jesus is still popular, and large crowds are still seeking Him in hopes of receiving healing from their infirmities. There is no room in the house and no way for the paralytic to get to Jesus. Instead of waiting until the crowds have left, this man utilizes his friends to get him to Jesus. The result is the healing of his disease and, even more important, the forgiveness of sins. Nothing could stop this man from getting to Jesus. What would stop you from coming to Jesus? Do you have this same resolve?

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 3:1-12

Due to extra-biblical tradition, it was believed that to heal on the Sabbath was a form of work and was not permitted. In this passage, we see some were watching Jesus to see if He would heal so that they would have evidence to use against Him. Jesus would not be put off or intimidated by them. His healing on the Sabbath was an intentional act. "To do good" on the Sabbath was not a violation of Old Testament law, but a violation of the extra-biblical tradition of the Pharisees. Their traditions were missing the point of the Old Testament command to love God and neighbor.
