IESUS' DEVOTION QUESTIONED Mark 2:18-22

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 3:13-21

Jesus appointed twelve apostles to be with Him, but also so He could send them out to preach. They were to do what Jesus did and taught them. They were under the immediate oversight of Jesus, and this would be critical for them as they would soon oversee the ministry after Jesus' ascension. Their mission, the Great Commission, see Matthew 28:16-20, is our mission. Pray and ask the Lord how you can be more productive and fruitful, for Him, is carrying out the mission of the church.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 3:22-34

"Blasphemy of the Spirit...is not the occasional bad thought or episode of anger against God. Such things are sins, to be sure, but they are not the persistent, deliberate rejection of the Lord's work that shows itself in a willful attribution of God's actions to Satan himself. Such blasphemy is unforgivable not because the Lord is unwilling to forgive but because a person guilty of such sin has fully and finally hardened his heart against the grace of God." - Ligonier.org



Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 4:1-20

In today's parable, we get a front-row seat to Jesus, teaching about the various responses to the gospel. He describes four different types of soil that seed falls on. Some yield no result, while others yield considerable results. Jesus' point is that some people respond differently to the gospel than others. The truth found in this text is amazing and worth meditation. Our responsibility is not to manipulate people into producing much fruit. Instead, our responsibility is to faithfully sow the seed of the gospel and let the Spirit do the work that only He can do. Spread the message of the gospel and let God do the rest!

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 4:30-41

FRIDAY

The parable of the mustard seed is a metaphor that emphasizes small beginnings, but that leads to gradual, but significant growth. The comparison is with the kingdom of God, which begins in a small, almost unnoticed, way unlike what is popular and expected, but will grow into something remarkable. The kingdom of God is truly remarkable, indeed.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 4:21-29

The gospel message that we have received was never meant to be hidden but to be shared and proclaimed to a lost and dying world around us. This is the point of our passage today and a much-needed reminder in light of our current situation. We have an opportunity to share this light by our interaction with others. Are we pointing people to the comfort that God offers, or are we viewing others as a threat to our own safety? Are we pointing people to the ultimate threat of sin, or are we stoking the fire of fear and panic? Take advantage of this opportunity and share the gospel!

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 5:1-20

After Jesus heals the man with a demon, he is now "in his right mind" (v. 15). Being in his right mind means that he was functioning again as an image-bearer of God. This man was no longer under the control of demons. This man went from crying out, which would indicate continual screaming with intense emotion, to being of sound mind. Christ has power overall, as is made clear as He commands these demons.
