MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 10:1-16

When the Pharisees approached Christ, on the question of divorce, it was not to gain a greater understanding of the topic. They sought to test Jesus in the hope of discrediting Him publically. They were hoping to expose Jesus, as an opponent of the Law of Moses, so that it would be easier to destroy Him. Instead of taking a side, which is what the Pharisees wanted, Jesus emphasized that marriage is a permanent relationship between a man and a woman. Jesus goes back to God's purpose at the beginning of creation. Where Jesus is focused, God's purpose for marriage, is where we are to be focused. Pray that Jesus' focus for marriage would be the focus for all, both in and out of the church.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 10:17-34

The rich young man was relying on his possessions and his self-righteousness to inherit eternal life. He was not relying on faith and trust. His reaction was contrary to having a childlike trust (Mark 10:13-16). Is there a part of your life where you rely on self or possessions when you should be trusting the Lord? Search your heart and ask the Lord to help you to trust in Him and not yourself or possessions.



Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 10:35-52

In today's passage, Jesus again focuses on correcting the disciple's misunderstanding about discipleship. James and John request that Jesus give them positions of authority (V.35-37). Instead of condemning their desire for greatness, Jesus corrects it and shows them that greatness is through service (V.42-45). This goes against the culture of their time as well as our own. Greatness in our time is associated with accomplishments. Jesus speaks to us as he speaks to the disciples. Desire greatness but realize that greatness comes through service. How are you serving?

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 11:1-11

Today's passage is one of the most well-known passages in the bible. Here, we see Jesus' triumphant entry into the city of Jerusalem. People shout, "Hosanna" and "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord". They were praising Jesus because they misunderstood His purpose. He was not going to free them from the shackles of the Romans but the shackles of their sin. In just one week this crowd would be shouting for His blood. Before we rush to condemn these people, ask yourself what false expectations you have of Jesus. Do you think He came to give you a good marriage, a good life, healthy children, and large bank accounts? Where are your expectations out of line with who Jesus really is?

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 11:12-19

FRIDAY

"Why did Jesus curse the fig tree in Mark 11? Jesus, among other things, was a prophet. One of the most graphic forms of prophetic communication in the Old Testament was the object lesson. The prophet would take something from nature or everyday life, as Amos did with a plumb line, and use it to communicate God's truth. Here Jesus found an object that illustrated the sin of hypocrisy. It had the appearance of fruitfulness, but it was actually barren. Throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus strongly denounced the sin of hypocrisy. That was His basic critique of the Pharisees of His day (Luke 12:1). On several occasions, Jesus chastened religious leaders for their show of spirituality and righteousness despite their underlying lack of fruit." - R.C. Sproul

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 11:20-33

In today's passage, the chief priests, scribes, and elders came to challenge the authority of Jesus. Jesus did not measure up to their standards and did not have the official credentials to speak and to act as He was. To them, Jesus was an untrained, self-appointed rabbi whom they did not recognize. What ends up happening is that Jesus exposes their ignorance and lack of sincerity. We, too, can think that just because someone is "untrained" or doesn't have specific "credentials" that they are not as talented or capable. However, in the body of Christ, there is knowledge and wisdom, and gifts. The purpose is to use what the Lord has equipped us with "for building up the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:12). Being a Christian is the only qualification or credential needed.
