MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 12:1-12

“The parable of the tenants, then, points to the glory and power of God in orchestrating the rejection and exaltation of His Son and the continuation of His kingdom (“this was the Lord’s doing”). In this, it greatly encourages us when we see the church under attack from professed leaders who are really wolves in sheep’s clothing. John Calvin comments, ‘Whatever may be the contrivances of men, God has at the same time declared, that in setting up the kingdom of Christ, His power will be victorious.’” - Ligonier.org

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 12:13-27

Jesus' opponents sent Pharisees and Herodians to present Jesus with difficult questions. They sought to trap Jesus on the question of paying taxes to Caesar. By not paying taxes, it would be in rebellion to against Caesar, whereas being willing to pay taxes would appear to compromise devotion to God. Jesus, however, knew of their hypocrisy. Jesus does imply that it is right to pay taxes to Caesar, but He also shows that God's things transcend everything else. In doing so, Jesus does not compromise devotion to God and does not rebel against Caesar. Jesus' answer was not what they were hoping for and also not what they expected as we're told that "they marveled at him." (v. 17).

WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 12:28-37

In today's passage Jesus is approached by a teacher of the law. The text doesn't indicate that he is trying to trick Jesus, but it may reflect the thinking of the time. The religious elite had added extra-biblical commands that people had to abide by. This thinking implied that there were some laws that were more important than others. Jesus cuts through this thinking and shows that the heart of all law is to love God and love others (V.29-31). Jesus' words are as applicable to us as they were to this man. This is gets to the heart of what should motivate action. Are you growing in love for God and love for others?

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 13:1-13

"Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when all these things are about to be accomplished?" (v. 4). The disciples asked Jesus this question in response to the future destruction of the temple (v. 2). The destruction of the temple would occur as a result of its misuse by the leaders. The disciples assumed that the destruction of the temple would coincide with the end times. Jesus, however, corrects their thinking. Ultimately, God already knew about the destruction of the temple (70 A.D.) and knows when the end times will occur and when Jesus will return. What needs to be focused on is that God knows, and those who are His children will be preserved.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 12:38-44

Today's passage focuses on an impromptu teaching moment by Christ after seeing people give money. Some gave more, and some gave less. But instead of focusing on either of these groups, Jesus focuses on a poor widow. This woman caught Christ's attention because she gave out of her poverty. Proportionally she had given the most. In giving to God sacrificially, she completely entrusted herself to Him to provide her needs. Giving has the unique ability to reveal who or what we are depending on. How does your giving—time, money, resources—reflect your dependence on God?

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Mark 13:14-27

Jesus gives no specific timetable, about how long it will take for the end to come, after the temple's destruction. The focus is that the hope of Jesus' coming enables the Christian to endure affliction. It is Jesus who is our hope and who also gives hope. Whether it be current affliction or that which is to come, have hope in the person and work of Jesus Christ. Have hope that He is coming again. Have hope that you can endure because of Jesus Christ.
