MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 1:46-80

"This statement, this bursting forth of Mary into worship and praise and adoration, which we call 'The Magnificat', is something which is worthy of our most careful consideration. There is, perhaps, no better way of approaching the season of Christmas than to do so in terms of a consideration of this particular passage. TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 2:1-21

"And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn" (Luke 2:7). The eternal Son of God, being born as a man, is the greatest miracle in the history of the world. The birth of Christ is something we focus on and think about more when Christmastime approaches. However, this incredible should be near to our hearts and on our minds constantly. Take time to praise God for sending His Son. Praise God for the Incarnation!

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 2:22-52

Jesus' questions and understanding showed great wisdom and amazed those who were there (v. 47). We would expect this to be the case since this was Jesus. "After three days, they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions" (v. 46). While among the teachers, Jesus was utterly respectful, taking on the role of a student. Jesus, taking on the role of a student, showing respect to the teachers, is an excellent lesson for us today. We might have vast knowledge and wisdom and could be a teacher ourself, but we too need to be taught. We need to be the student and ask the questions. We need to humble ourselves and continuously be willing to learn and seek to be more like Christ.

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 3:23-38

We see in the book of Matthew, the genealogy of Jesus Christ, traces His lineage from Abraham. Matthew emphasizes Jesus' Jewish heritage. Here in Luke, Jesus' lineage is traced back to Adam. Luke shows that Jesus is the fulfillment of the hopes of all people. Reading through the genealogies may not be the most exciting read, but when you think about it, it actually is exciting to read. We are given, in both accounts, Matthew and Luke, clear evidence that Jesus is who He says He is. Thanks be to God for providing these genealogies as it provides greater assurance in Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 3:1-22

"A baptism of repentance" (v. 3) was a symbol to testify to the forgiveness that had already been received upon repentance. Repentance is a change of mind and a change of purpose from sin to God. To forsake sin and turn to trust in the person and work of Jesus Christ fully, is genuine repentance. Many acknowledge Christ but have not considered turning from their sin. Pray for true repentance. Pray for a turning from sin and a turning to Christ.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 4:1-15

"Because Jesus successfully passed His temptation, He was qualified to be the second Adam and merit a righteous status for us in the eyes of God. We cannot be the second Adam, but we can learn from Jesus' interaction with the devil how to defeat sin in our own life. Knowing and believing the Word of God is the most effective way to avoid sin and grow in holiness. Let us know Scripture well that we might stand firm against Satan." -Ligonier.org
