

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 4:16-37

"And he said, 'Truly, I say to you, no prophet is acceptable in his hometown'" (v. 24). When Jesus says "truly" as He does many times in the Gospels, He does so at the beginning of statements. He does this to emphasize what He is about to say. Each time you come across Jesus saying "truly" pay close attention to the truth that follows.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 4:38-44

Simon's mother in law was sick "with a high fever." We might pass by this, without giving it much thought just, thinking that Jesus simply healed a woman who was sick. However, the fact that we're told she had a "high fever" highlights a couple of different things for us. First, think back to a time when you may have had a high fever, or saw someone with a high temperature. Having a high fever is no joking matter. Jesus healing her, in this state, would have made a significant difference. Second, and most importantly, Jesus has the power to heal. Jesus "rebuked the fever," and His power is highlighted by the fact that she rose immediately. The passage goes on to the care and attention Jesus gave in healing the crowd of people who had come to Him. Jesus did not perform a group healing, but like Simon's mother in law, Jesus cared for each of them individually.

Wednesday

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 5:1-16

What was Simon's response after the large fish catch? He fell to his knees! He was amazed by the miracle as it was a demonstration of the presence of God. Simon Peter understood that God was working through Jesus; he would later come to a deeper understanding of who Jesus is. By recognizing the presence of God, it was the first step in understanding who Jesus is. It was only after the resurrection that the disciples fully understood who Jesus is. Praise God for the gift of Scripture. Praise Him that we have His revelation to us and know who Jesus is.

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 6:1-36

"Jesus condemns the rich in Luke 6:24 because their use of money showed where their heart was: they used it to secure their lives and pad themselves with comfort and luxury and consolation, instead of using it to meet the needs of the suffering." - John Piper

Thursday

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 5:17-39

Jesus called Levi. Levi, as a tax collector, would have had much, but also would have been despised. Levi responded by leaving everything. The invitation, to follow Christ, is a total commitment to Christ. We, too, must be willing to leave, everything this world has to offer, to follow Christ, but following Christ is worth it.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 6:37-49

"Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven" (v. 37). What Jesus is condemning here is not legitimate church discipline or our discernment. Jesus is condemning the tendency of finding fault in and the criticizing of others. Anyone can easily be easily ensnared in the trap of judging and condemning others. Pray and ask the Lord to keep you from this temptation.
