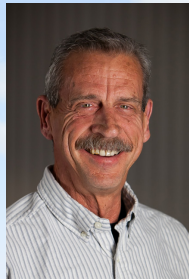

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 7:1-17

The centurion, who would have been in charge of a hundred men, could do much because of the authority given to him. The centurion showed humility when he said, “I am not worthy” (v. 6). He also showed that he had great faith when he said, “say the word” (v. 7). The centurion recognized Jesus’ authority to do so much more than he could. Jesus commends the centurion’s (who was a gentile) humble faith. “Not even in Israel” (v. 9) had Jesus seen such faith. The centurion’s faith also foreshadows the Gentile’s entry into the kingdom of God. Jesus commends this man who approached Him with a humble faith. This reminds us that we, too, are to approach Jesus with humble faith.

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 7:18-35

As Jesus explains, John the Baptist, was more than just a prophet, he was the prophet who was sent to fulfill Malachi 3:1. Jesus uses the description of a “reed shaken by the wind” (v. 24). A reed shaken by the wind is something flimsy, something that is uncertain. He also describes someone in soft clothing or like someone who lives in luxury (v. 25). Jesus describes such things that are far from who John was. Of John the Baptist, Jesus says that he is “among those born of women none is greater than John” (v. 28). John the Baptist was greater than the Old Testament prophets. Yet Jesus tells us that “the one who is least in the kingdom of God” (v. 28) is greater than John. Jesus is saying that those who believe in Him, after the cross, are greater than John because they are actual participants in the atoning work of Christ.

WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 7:36-50

Today's passage centers on the interaction Jesus has with two sinners. One, a woman with a reputation, approaches Jesus out of love and reverence because she is well aware of the sin she has been forgiven. The other, a self-righteous Pharisee, approaches Jesus with contempt because he doesn't think Jesus is as righteous as he. Jesus makes the point that their interaction with Him is based on their view of themselves. The one who knows the depth of their sin responds in gratitude and love, while the other is cold and judgmental. What does your interaction with Christ say about how you view yourself?

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 8:1-25

Luke uses verses 22-25 of our passage to put Jesus' power on display. Luke will show that Jesus has power of the forces of this world, beginning with creation (v.22-25) and ending with death (v.40-42). Our passage begins with a terrible storm and the disciple's plea for Jesus' help. He displays His power by calming the storm with mere words. They pose a question that the audience already knows the answer to, "Who then is this, that he commands even the winds and water and they obey him?" Jesus is Lord over creation. This same Lord gave himself as a ransom for us. Praise God for the mercy and love he shows us!

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 8:26-39

"Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.' And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him" (v. 39). This verse highlights two important things for us. First, it was Jesus who healed the man with the demon. Yet, Jesus says to return home "and declare how much God has done for you." This indicates that Jesus has the same status as God. Second is that for those who believe in Jesus and follow Him, it is their responsibility to evangelize. "And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him." Those who are Christians should consider all that Jesus has done for them and then go out and proclaim Jesus to the world.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 8:40-56

"After discovering who touched Him, Jesus praises the woman's faith. But Jairus' daughter has now died (vv. 47-49). Still, Jesus calls Jairus to trust in His power over death, for it would have been easy to think Jesus was a mere magician; instead, Jesus insists that Jairus show faith (v. 50). Despite the difficulty he had trusting God in the face of death, Jairus brings Jesus to his home, and the girl is raised to life (vv. 51-56). May we also trust in the Lord to touch us and make us new." - Ligonier.org
