ENCOURAGEMENT FOR WEAK WITNESSES Mark 4:26-34

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 9:1-22

"Then he said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' And Peter answered, 'The Christ of God'" (v. 20). Peter was not the first to confess that Jesus is "The Christ of God." Jesus' identity as the "Christ" has previously been confessed by angels (Luke 2:11), by the Gospel narrator (Luke 2:26), by demons (Luke 4:41), and even by Jesus Himself (Luke 4:18). Peter, however, is the first by one of the twelve. Yet there is still much for them to learn about what this means. What they are beginning to understand is that Jesus is so much more than a prophet. We know who Jesus is as we have the rest of the story. Having these truths written for us is beyond compare. As you read your Bible, take the time to praise the Lord for His written revelation. Praise His for giving us all that we need to know who Jesus is and what He has done. Praise His for providing all we need to know for life and godliness (2 Peter 1:3).

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 9:23-45

The Transfiguration provides a glimpse of the future glory of Jesus Christ. The description of Him being "dazzling white" could be likened to being as bright as a flash of lightning. The illumination of the Transfiguration was not external but came from the inside. In the Transfiguration, we also see into the reality that Jesus Christ is the transcendent Son of God. The Son of God was sent by the Father to be the Savior of His people, both the Jew and the Gentile. Christ is the Savior for all who believe in Him.

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 9:46-62

Today's passage contains a very important marker in Luke's gospel. Verse 51 indicates a new section in which Jesus "sets his face to go to Jerusalem." This verse signals that Jesus is resolute in his purpose to fulfill God's will to reconcile sinners to Himself. Jesus will face betrayal, injustice, and ultimately death. Luke highlights the fact that anyone who would follow this king must have radical self-denial and devotion to him (v.57-62). Have you considered the cost of following Christ today?

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 10:17-24

FRIDAY

The seventy-two returned with joy (v. 17). They were filled with joy because they were seeing the kingdom of God advance. People were being set free from bondage and demonic oppression. When we hear of the kingdom of God advancing, we also should be filled with joy. Our hearts should be full of praise. Think of people you know who have come to know Christ as Savior whether recent or not, knowing this should bring about joy and praise in your heart.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 10:1-16

Today's passage focuses on the sending out of the seventy-two. Here, Jesus is sending people before him to proclaim the gospel of the kingdom of God (v.9). Many principles can be gleaned from our passage, but focus on the big picture. Jesus uses unworthy sinners to proclaim the good news of the gospel because the "harvest is plentiful." This continues to be the way that Christ is building his church. Christ uses you and me to spread the gospel that reconciles the nations to God Himself! What a privilege we have before us!

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 10:25-42

Even the wisest and understanding, among us, may not fully understand the most straightforward commands of Scripture. We can see this in the parable of the good samaritan. Both a priest and a Levite, the wise and understanding, "passed by on the other side" (v. 32). It was a Samaritan who stopped to help a Jew, which would have been unthinkable at the time. Jesus is making the point that loving one's neighbor is about showing love and compassion, even to those who we would typically not have any relationship with.
