MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 13:1-9

"No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (v. 3). The word repent, or repentance is use over one hundred times in the Bible. Knowing this, and as is evident in this passage, is that we do not know what tomorrow may bring. The time is now to repent. It is because we do not know what tomorrow will bring, reminds us of the urgency and need to share the gospel. Pray for opportunities to share Christ today so that those who hear would repent and believe.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 13:10-21

In today's passage, Jesus speaks in a parable of the mustard seed. The mustard seed would have been the smallest known seed to the people whom Jesus was talking to. The small seed will eventually grow into something large enough that birds can make nests on. Compared to the seed, the tree is enormous. Jesus is comparing this to what the kingdom of God is like (v. 18). The contrast is that of the final state kingdom to that of its humble beginnings. This teaching would have been quite different from what the Jews were expecting, which was that of the kingdom coming immediately, with power bringing judgment on all evil.

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 13:22-35

Today's passage highlights a number of important themes. Verses 22-30 warn about the danger of being excluded from the saved while verses 31-35 warn about the danger of Jerusalem rejecting Jesus. But don't lose sight of the big picture in these passages. Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem to die as a ransom for many. These passages showcase a crucial theme in the book of Luke. God's reign will not be derailed by hostility from human rulers or by Jerusalem's unbelief.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 14:1-11

Our passage today presents yet another interaction with the Pharisees. We aren't told who, but a Pharisee invites Jesus to dine with him at his house (v.1). Again, we see Jesus perceiving their thoughts and presenting a question about doing good on the Sabbath (v.3). Jesus heals a man while a room full of the religious elite watch in silence (v.4). This passage continues the theme from yesterday. Nothing, including hostility and opposition from the Pharisees, will prevent Jesus from accomplishing his mission.

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 14:12-24

"He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just'" (vv. 12-14). Jesus is not prohibiting inviting your friends, or relatives, or the rich to share a meal. Jesus is emphasizing that we are to be generous towards those who are in need, both physically and economically. We are to be generous to those who cannot repay us for what you have done for them.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 14:25-35

"Following Christ is a journey that comes at a high price. This is not a relationship to be entered into lightly. This decision requires the commitment of our entire life to Jesus Christ. Coming to Christ takes priority over every other pursuit in life. It necessitates the submission of our wills to Him as we surrender to His lordship. This path requires our sacrifice and, at times, even suffering for Him. To be sure, Jesus will not follow us, we are called to follow Him." - Steven Lawson
