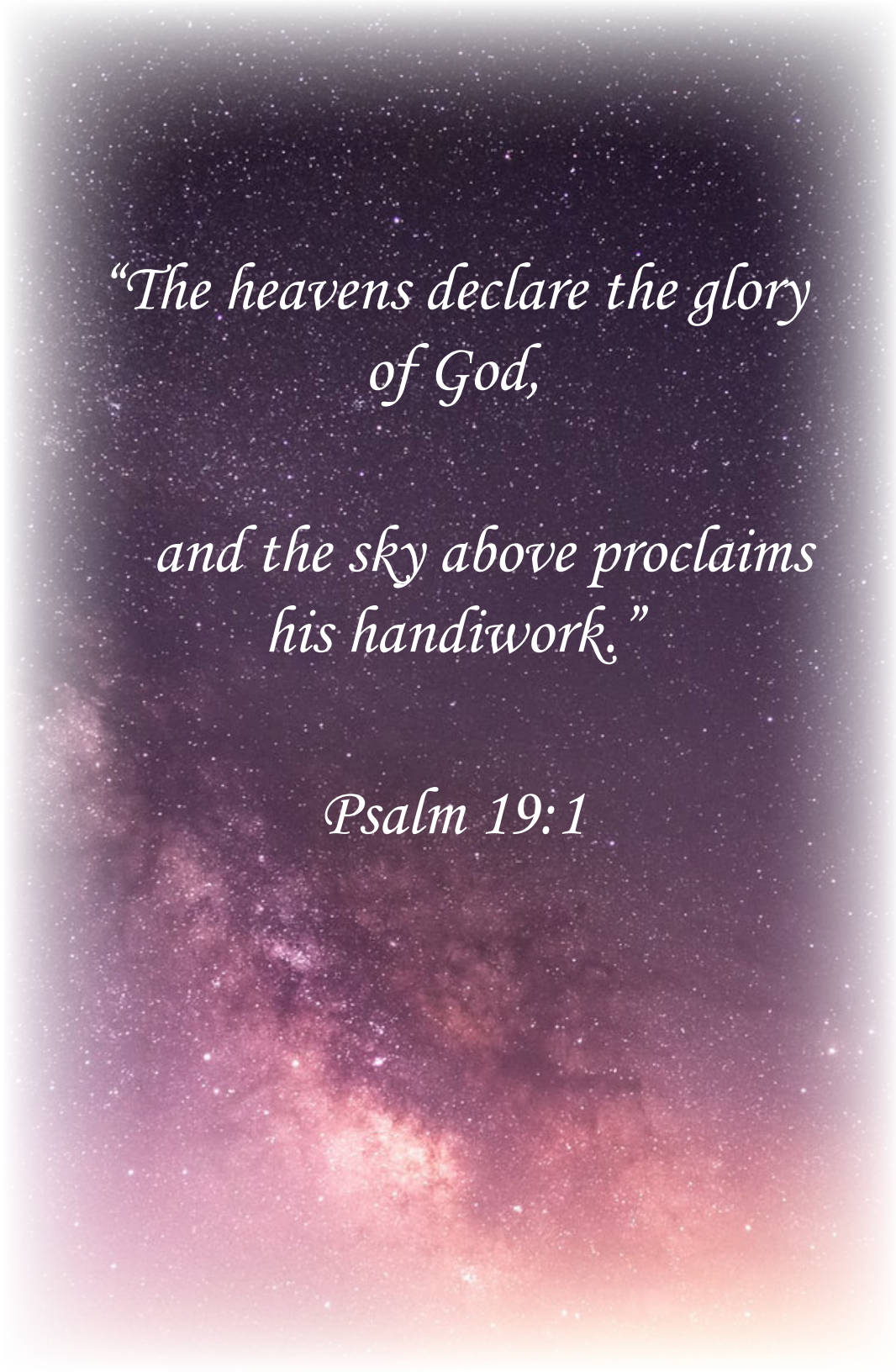

MONDAY

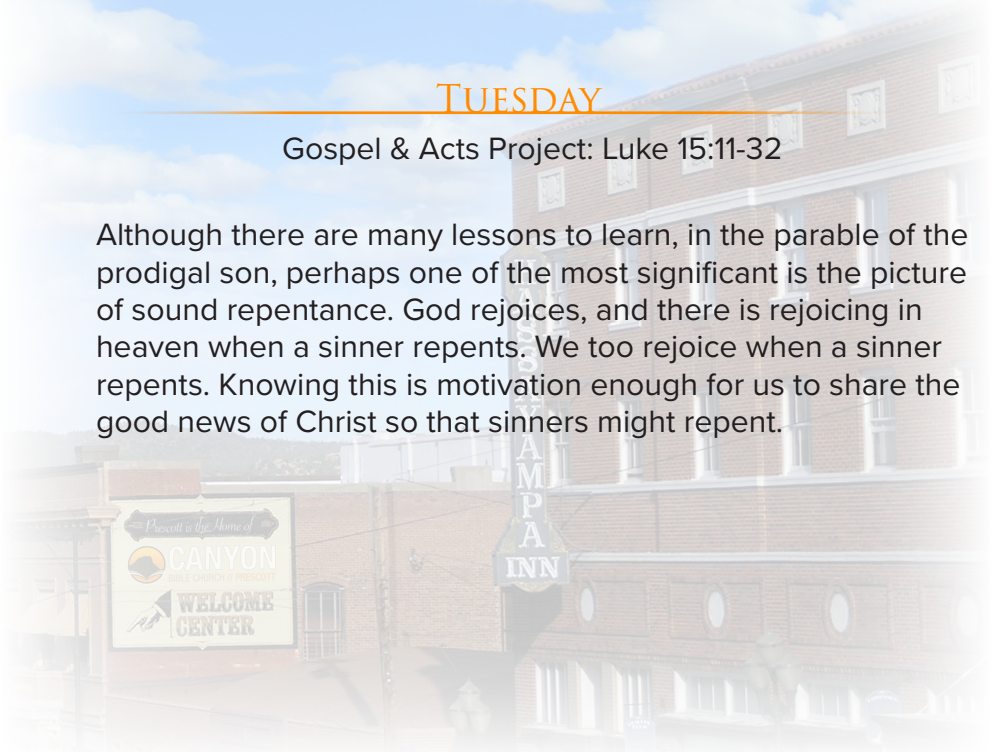
Gospel &amp; Acts Project: Luke 15:1-10

“Luke 15 contains some of the most powerful illustrations of the love of God for His sinful people. The parables of the lost sheep (vv. 1–7) and the lost coin (vv. 8–10), in particular, demonstrate the eagerness with which God pursues sinners and the joy He experiences whenever someone repents. If we are to be imitators of God (Eph. 5:1), we must likewise pursue sinners and call them to repentance.” - Ligonier.org

## TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 15:11-32

Although there are many lessons to learn, in the parable of the prodigal son, perhaps one of the most significant is the picture of sound repentance. God rejoices, and there is rejoicing in heaven when a sinner repents. We too rejoice when a sinner repents. Knowing this is motivation enough for us to share the good news of Christ so that sinners might repent.





## WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 16:1-13

“No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money” (v. 13). Being devoted to money and being devoted to God are two things that are not compatible—having riches, although not a bad thing, does not mean that one has a divine blessing. Money can very easily cause one to become idolatrous. Jesus makes it clear that a person cannot serve both. He is not saying that you should not serve both; Jesus is saying that you cannot serve both.

## THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 16:14-18

After hearing what Jesus had taught (Luke 16:1-13), the Pharisees responded with ridicule. Why? Because they “were lovers of money” (v. 14). Jesus responded to them, saying, “You are those who justify yourselves before men, but God knows your hearts. For what is exalted among men is an abomination in the sight of God” (v. 15). At times we might be tempted to justify ourselves before men. Jesus reminds us that God knows the heart, but the language here is strong. If what we do what is exalted before men, if man praises that which is against God, that thing is an abomination in the sight of God. Seek not to be justified before men; seek to be justified before God.

## FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 16:19-31

“He said to him, ‘If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead’” (v. 31). The rich man believed that by seeing Lazarus, return from the dead, that he would be a sign confirming what the Old Testament says. The result, he hoped, would be that the rich man’s brothers would repent. However, these brothers already knew of “Moses and the Prophets” who point to Jesus as the true Messiah. If they do not believe Moses and the Prophets, someone returning from the dead is not going to cause them to repent. Faith comes by hearing the word of God (Rom. 10:17). Through common grace, people are shown many beautiful and spectacular things, but this does not save. It is the gospel that has the power to save. As this passage reminds us, the time is now to tell others of Christ.

## SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 17:1-10

Temptations are sure to come, but this does not excuse anyone from being the cause of tempting another to sin. Jesus tells us, “woe to the one through whom they come” (v. 1). We must not only be cautious about what tempts us, but also that we might cause another to be tempted. Pray and ask the Lord to keep you from temptation and also ask the Lord to keep you from tempting others.
