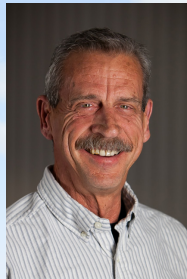

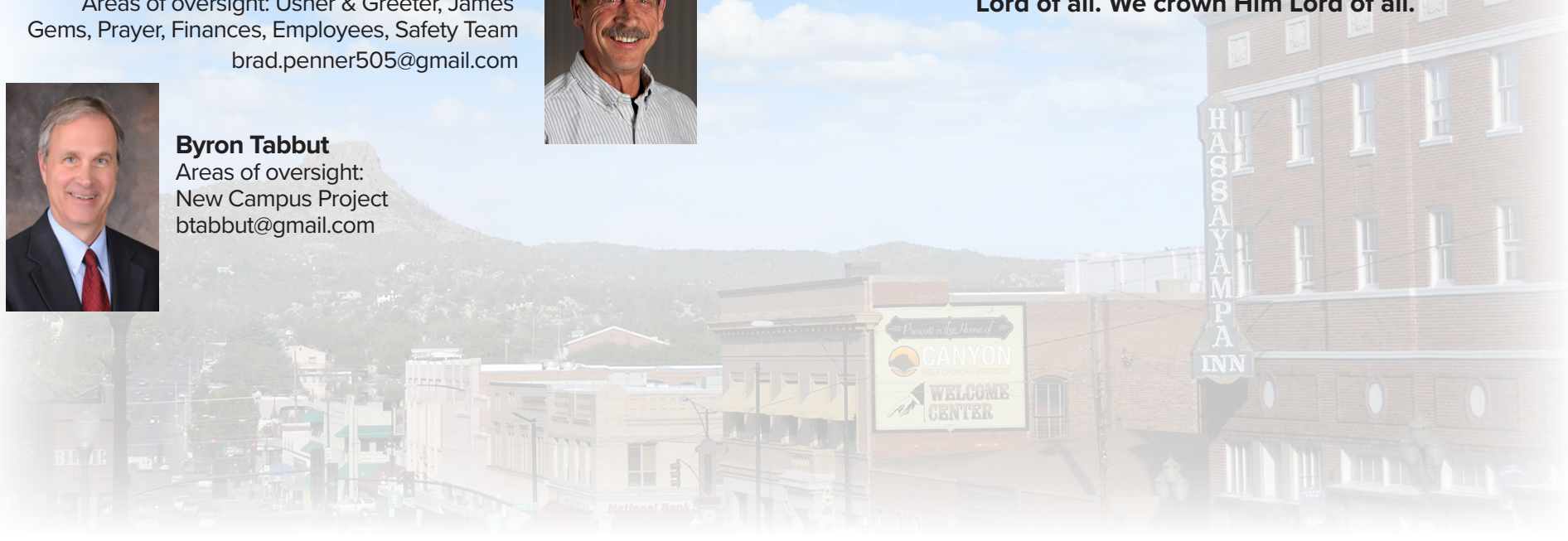

## FAITH GREATER THAN THE GRAVE

Mark 5:21-43

## MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 24:13-35

“Why do you suppose these two men were ‘kept from recognizing’ Jesus for hours (v. 16)? The clue, I think, is in verse 25. Jesus called them ‘foolish’ and ‘slow of heart to believe’ the Scriptures. Their outward inability to recognize Jesus mirrored their inward unbelief of what the Scriptures revealed about him. Now, Jesus fully intended to help them see. But notice the priority of Jesus’ revelation: before he opened their physical eyes, he purposed to open their heart-eyes. Why? Because it was of utmost importance that they ‘walk by faith, not by sight’ (2 Corinthians 5:7).” - Jon Bloom

## TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 24:36-53

Today’s passage, the appearance of Jesus to His disciples, emphasizes the physical reality of Jesus and His resurrected body. This passage also emphasizes the necessity of Jesus’ death and resurrection, which is needed to fulfill God’s plan. Take time to pray and praise the Lord that Jesus died and rose again, and what this means for your salvation.



## WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 1:1-18

Clinton Arnold has helpful insight for the beginning of John's gospel. Instead of reading the introduction to this gospel as a means to get to the substance, meditate on it. "The Gospel begins with a prologue that introduces the narrative. The introduction includes the plight of the world and the arrival of the unique son, the revelation (Word) of God, through whom the readers are invited to become children of the Father. It is an introduction not merely to [John's] gospel but also the gospel: The Son that God sent dwells among us, the fallen world that God loves." This gospel truly is good news to our lost and dying world.

## FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 1:35-51

Here we read of Jesus calling His disciples. Throughout the gospels, we learn of those who left behind their lives to follow Jesus. Three things are apparent when we think of Jesus calling disciples. One, it is Jesus who does the calling. Two, those whom He calls follow. Three, He continues to call people to follow Him today. Pray for those who are not following Jesus. Pray that they would hear the call and follow Him.

## THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 1:19-34

Today's passage is a continuation of John's prologue. He continues to set the scene to the narrative proper by bringing the reader's attention on John the Baptist. Much could be said about John and his role as "The voice crying out in the wilderness" (v.23). But, the substance of what John exclaims as he sees Jesus is far more important than who John is. He sees Christ and proclaims that He is "the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" (v.29). This lamb is the object of our worship today and the means by which we can enjoy reconciliation with a holy and just God.

## SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 2:1-12

In this passage, we read of "the first of his signs" (v. 11). These signs are miracles that attest to Jesus that He is the Messiah, the Son of God, to lead unbelievers to faith. After this first sign, we are told that "his disciples believed in him" (v. 11). These signs have been written for us that we, too, would know of what Jesus did as proof that He truly is the Messiah, the Son of God.
