WHAT DOES DECAPOLIS HAVE TO DO WITH PRESCOTT Mark 5:1-20

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 19:11-27

In referencing the Parable of the Ten Minas, the Reformation Study Bible states: "The punishment for not using what one has is to lose it, a principle of wide application. Those who use their spiritual opportunities find more, while those who do nothing about them lose what opportunity they do have." The expectation was that Jesus, nearing the end of His journey to Jerusalem, would establish the kingdom and expel the Romans. At the time, there was a misunderstanding of the timing and character of God's plan. The reminder for us, in this parable, is that we do not know the day and time, and therefore we are to make the best use of the time we have. There are opportunities before us to share the gospel, and we need to use those opportunities while we can.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 19:28-40

"And when he had said these things, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem" (v. 28). Luke reminds his readers that Jesus was headed to Jerusalem. It is in Jerusalem that Jesus will suffer rejection and death, which will ultimately lead to His resurrection. Jesus knew this was coming, yet He did not shy away from or attempt to delay what was to come. In this, we praise Him for what He came and did for us so that we, through His sacrifice, would be saved.

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 19:41-48

In today's passage, we see the heart of Jesus as he weeps and laments over Jerusalem. Immediately after his triumphal entry, Luke recounts Jesus weeping over the city (v.41). His tears are a result of Jerusalem's hard heart and ultimate refusal to recognize its divine king. This refusal will result in utter destruction foretold by Christ himself (v.43-44). Rejection of Christ will always bring destruction—either physically or spiritually. But He stands, beckoning all people everywhere to repent and submit to Him. Have you bent the knee to Christ? If so, have you shared this reality of impending judgment with someone who does not?

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 20:1-18

Rebellion against God is completely pointless. This is the point highlighted by Christ in the parable of the wicked tenants (v.9-18). He tells the story of a landowner that rented his land to tenants. He sent a servant to reap a part of the harvest of the land that was rightfully his. Instead of submitting to the landowner, the tenants beat each servant that was sent. This action persisted until they killed the land owner's son. This brought destruction on the wicked tenants. Rebellion against God is futile. God's judgment is not always quick. But make no mistake—all rebellion will be judged by God.

Gospel & Acts Project: Luke 20:19-26

FRIDAY

Today we find what is to some a familiar passage. Paying taxes to Caesar. For Christians there is a great lesson to be learned from Jesus' response. However, consider for a moment verse 20. "So they watched him and sent spies, who pretended to be sincere, that they might catch him in something he said, so as to deliver him up to the authority and jurisdiction of the governor." There are many who in attempting to challenge Jesus appear to be sincere. It can be easy for anyone to be swept up in the sincerity of a false teacher or a wolf asking "innocent" questions. Our best defense, our best response, against such opposition is to know Scripture. Pray and ask the Lord to give you a greater desire to be in His word and to understand His word.
