Mark 6:7-30

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 7:1-24

During the Feasts of Booths, the people would live in leafy shelters as a way to remember God's faithfulness to Israel while she was wandering in the wilderness. It was also a time where they would give thanksgiving for the harvest. We do not celebrate such things today. However, it is a good thing that we remember what the Lord has done for us in the past. Take time to meditate on how the Lord has blessed you in your life. Pray and thank Him for His faithfulness to you.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 7:25-36

"Despite the renewed attempts to arrest Jesus, it is clear that these efforts would prove to be in vain. It was not yet the moment for Jesus to be arrested and tried; that would happen at the time of His choosing. He would be going where the people would not be able to find Him (vv. 32–34). The reference here is obviously to Jesus' ascension to heaven after His resurrection (Acts 1:6–11). True, our Lord would eventually be handed over to the authorities and killed, but He would finally escape them by rising from the dead on the third day and returning to His heavenly Father. But the people had no idea what He was talking about (John 7:35–36). They could not fathom that He spoke of returning to His Father in heaven because they did not yet realize that He was more than a mere man, that He was God incarnate who would determine the time of His departure." - Ligonier.org

Gospel & Acts Project: John 7:32-52

Gospel & Acts Project: John 8:31-47

The Feast of Tabernacles was celebrated with certain festival rituals. One was a solemn procession each day from the temple to the Gihon Spring. A priest filled a gold pitcher with water while the choir sang Isaiah 12:3. Then they returned to the altar and poured out the water. This ritual reminded them of the water from the rock during the wilderness wanderings. It also served as a reminder that the messiah would come and deliver Israel. In today's passage, Jesus hones in on this event and uses it as an illustration for the salvation He provides. Jesus is the source of this wellspring of life which is the indwelling Holy Spirit. Have you been satisfied with this wellspring of life?

"So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, 'If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (v. 31-32). To abide in Jesus is to continue believing in what He's said and being obedient to Him, and this is a test of a true disciple.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 7:53-8:30

Today's passage is the second "I am" statement of Christ. During the Feast of Booths, the Jews would light large candles in the temple court. The light reminded the Jewish people of how God was with them in their wanderings in the wilderness in a pillar of cloud which turned to fire at night. This context provides the starting point for Jesus' statement. Yes, he is the light of the world in this context, but so much more. John has begun this theme of light in the prologue of his gospel (Jn 1:4-5). Jesus is not simply a guide through life or a presence in trials. He is the judge of the world that condemns sin while at the same time atoning for this sin that was not his. Praise God for His love and mercy that was displayed in the incarnation and crucifixion of Christ!

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 8:48-59

By stating, "before Abraham was, I am" (v. 58), Jesus is leaving no doubt about who He is claiming to be. He does not say "I was" before Abraham, indicating He was more than 2,000 years old. No, Jesus is stating "I am," speaking of His transcendence, which could only be claimed by God.
