# FAITH GREATER THAN THE GRAVE

Mark 5:21-43

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MONDAY

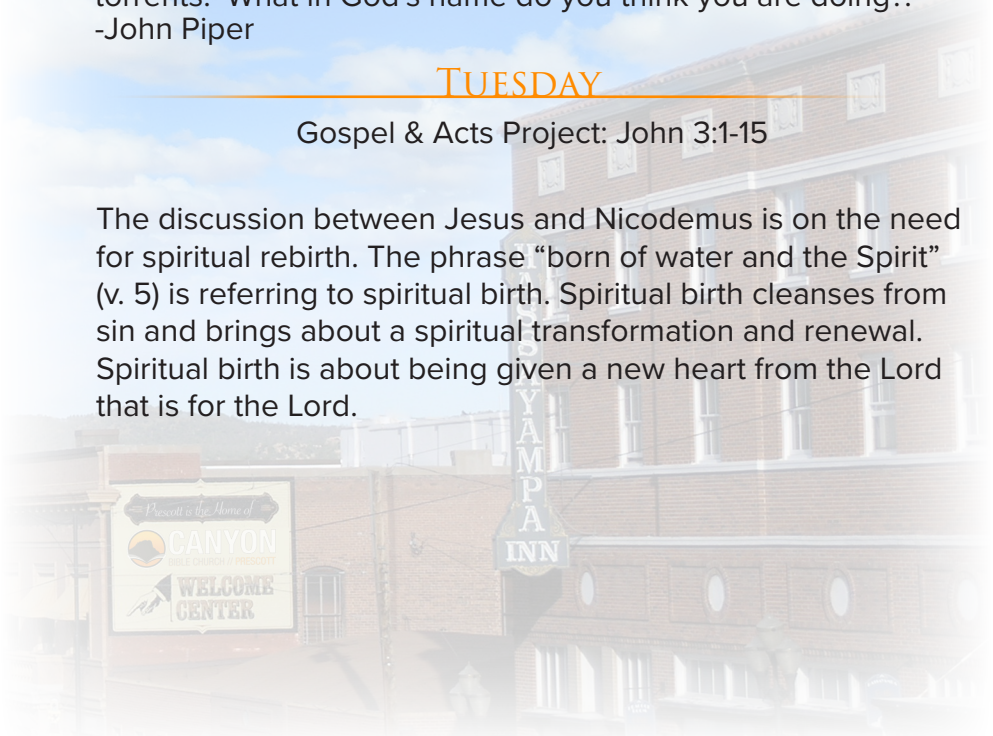
Gospel &amp; Acts Project: John 2:13-25

“So what matters here is what Jesus does say. He says, in verse 16, ‘Take these things away; do not make my Father’s house a house of trade.’ Jesus does not say that the sellers and money-changers are robbers, or that the animals are defective, or that the place is a place of prayer—though it is. He says that they have turned his Father’s house into a bazaar. An emporium. A market. The disciples saw this incredible display of fury—he was using a homemade whip of ropes, and loosing the oxen (oxen are big!), and dumping boxes of money on the ground, and turning over tables, and saying (with who knows how piercing a voice over all the bleating), ‘Take these things away; do not make my Father’s house a house of trade.’ And when the disciples saw this, they connected it with Psalm 69:9 where David the king says, ‘Zeal for your house has consumed me, and the reproaches of those who reproach you have fallen on me.’ Jesus was consumed with zeal for his Father’s house. And reproaches were, no doubt, raining down on him like torrents: ‘What in God’s name do you think you are doing?!’”

## TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 3:1-15

The discussion between Jesus and Nicodemus is on the need for spiritual rebirth. The phrase “born of water and the Spirit” (v. 5) is referring to spiritual birth. Spiritual birth cleanses from sin and brings about a spiritual transformation and renewal. Spiritual birth is about being given a new heart from the Lord that is for the Lord.





## WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 3:16-21

Today's passage is a much-needed reminder regarding love. Our society tells us that love is only an emotion that comes from things like giving gifts or getting something valuable in return. This interaction between Jesus and Nicodemus sheds light on what love is. The audience sees that the motivation behind the incarnation and our redemption is love, which is action taken by one party for the good or benefit of another. It is putting someone else's interests before your own even if it costs you to do so. How do your actions line up? Can they be characterized by a biblical love, or are they more akin to society's definition of love?

## THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 3:22-36

Clinton Arnold provides a helpful commentary on today's passage. "The Christian message is at its core very personal. It involves the whole person—not merely his mind but also his life. The ministry of the Christian intrudes on all areas of life. For that reason, the Christian must make sure that the message he proclaims is the gospel of Jesus Christ and not some other, potentially attractive 'good news'. The way this becomes confusing is when the gospel gets mixed with the symptoms of the gospel. Examples abound, and each would need to be objectively explored, but the point is that the message is not the messenger. The Christian life is not about getting God into your story, but about getting your life into God's story. To confuse your story with God's is to confuse the gospel, to confuse the message with the messenger."

## FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 4:1-45

In today's passage, it is implied that the woman was converted. However, this passage reinforces John's theme that Jesus is the Messiah. We also see Jesus' love, compassion, and understanding of people. Jesus, out of His love for people, reached out to this woman who was a social outcast. Christ's love is all-encompassing and does not discriminate.

## SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 4:46-54

"Jesus said to him, 'Go; your son will live.' The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way" (John 4:50). Concerning this passage John MacArthur writes: "Jesus met the demands of the Galilean unbelief by healing the official's son, revealing not only his sympathy, but his marvelous graciousness in spite of such a faithless demand for miracles." We truly serve a loving and gracious God.
