THE MINISTRY OF MEETING NEEDS Mark 6:30-44

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 9:1-41

Jesus provided physical light to a man born blind. The passage reminds us of who Jesus is. Jesus is the light of the world, and in Him is no darkness at all. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:4-5). This powerful truth gives the believer hope and assurance of their salvation.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 10:1-21

Jesus is the Good Shepherd and the door of the sheep. The only way in which one can be part of the family of God is through Jesus. John 14:6 tells us that no one comes to the Father except through Jesus. Those who already know Jesus are aware of this and are grateful for the Good Shepherd. However, many have been deceived into thinking that there are other ways to God. Pray for those who have been deceived. Pray that they would come to know Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: John 10:22-42

Today's passage is another interaction between the religious elite and Jesus. The dialogue begins with a plea from the Jewish authorities for Jesus to confirm or deny His true identity. Jesus then indicates that He is one with God, thereby claiming deity. The Jews respond by an attempt to stone Jesus. But notice how this passage begins and ends. The Jews do not believe (v.25,26), while many across the Jordan believed (v.42). There is no room for indecision. Either Jesus is Lord, and we believe, or he is liar/lunatic, and we do not believe. How do you view Jesus, and are you responding to Him appropriately if He is Lord?

Gospel & Acts Project: John 11:17-27

FRIDAY

Eternal life and fellowship with God are only found in Jesus. These things are so closely tied with Jesus that He embodies them and are only found in relationship to Him. It is because Jesus is the "resurrection and the life" that "whoever believes in" (v. 25) Jesus, that is whoever has placed their personal trust in Christ, will have eternal life and fellowship with God. It is for those who believe who "shall never die" (v. 26), meaning that they will ultimately triumph over death.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 11:1-16

Today's passage begins the well-known story of Lazarus. The narrator tells the reader that a man whom Jesus loved was ill. After receiving this news, Jesus waits two additional days before they depart to Judea. This decision was intentional and made "so that [the disciples] may believe." Everything, including death, can be used by God for our benefit and His glory. What in your life appears negative? What are you struggling with? What causes you pain? Turn and trust in the one who can use it for the glory of God.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 11:28-44

"In John 11, Jesus weeps. His tears, shed in response to Lazarus' death and Mary and Martha's grief, are full of embodied truth, beauty, and goodness. Why did Jesus weep? He delayed coming to Bethany "so that the Son of God may be glorified through it" (John 11:4), and, when He arrived, informed Martha that He is "the resurrection and the life" (v. 25). If He came to Bethany to show His power, the fact that He is indeed the Messiah with the power to resurrect the dead, why did He not simply wave His "magic wand" to "solve the problem" of the death and illness of Lazarus? There would have been an immediate celebration, and all the tears would have been unnecessary. Tears are useless, even wasteful, if you possess the power to cause miracles. Instead, He made Himself vulnerable, stopped to feel the sting of death, to identify with frail humanity, who struggled to know hope." -Makoto Fujimura
