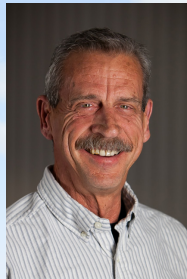

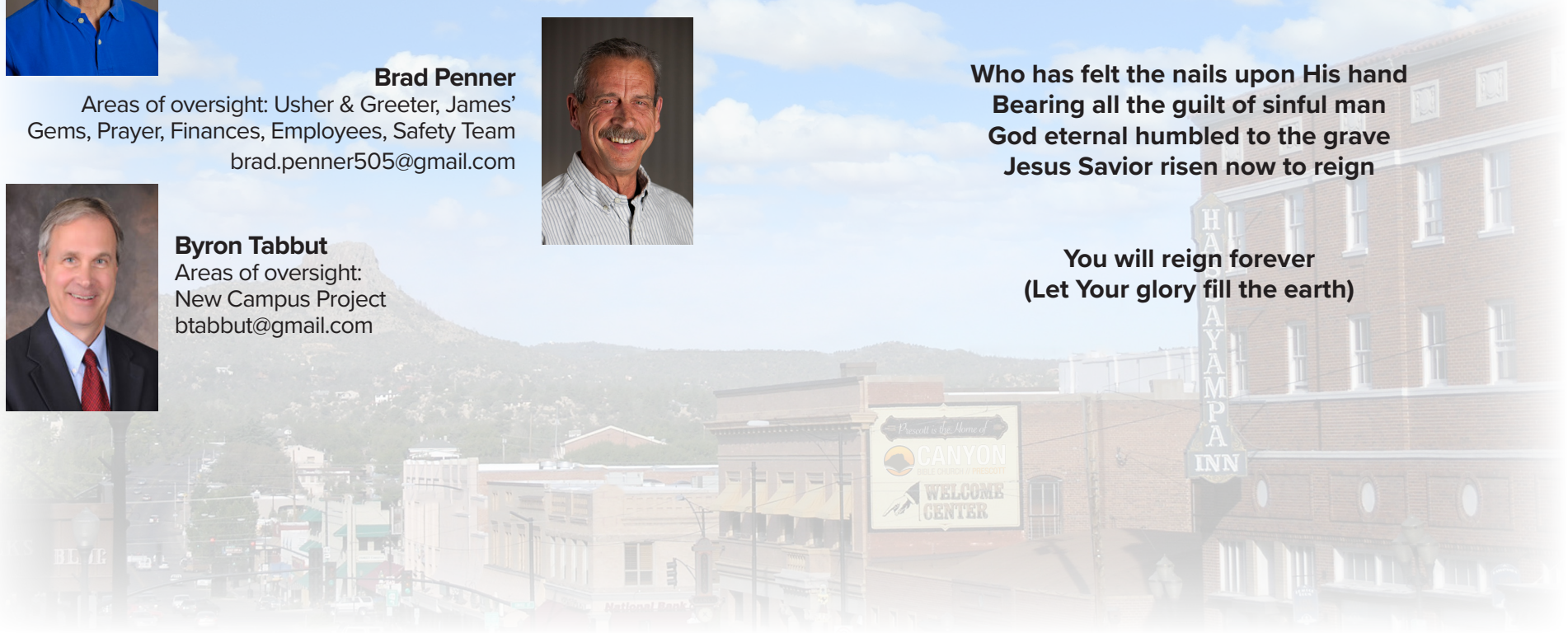
**Who has held the oceans in His hands

Gospel & Acts Project: John 5:1-17

“So the Jews said to the man who had been healed, ‘It is the Sabbath, and it is not lawful for you to take up your bed’” (v. 10). There was nothing in the Old Testament that prohibited anyone from carrying their bedroll. Instead, he violated Jewish tradition. Such traditions were burdensome rules. There are commands in Scripture to follow, and we should seek to follow those commands. We are not, however, to place unbiblical rules on ourselves or others. Having to adhere to commands, outside of Scripture, is harmful and takes away the joy and freedom the believer has in Christ.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 5:18-29

“This was why the Jews were seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God” (v. 18). By claiming to be the Son of God, Jesus was not saying that He is God’s son, as ordinary believers would claim as being a child of God. Jesus, in claiming to be the Son of God, was claiming to be equal with God in every way. Jesus was not merely a man, because if He were His claim would be blasphemous, which is what the Jews thought. Jesus claimed to be the Son of God because He is God.

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WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 5:30-47

How could the religious elite know the scripture so well yet miss the one to whom they point to? How could someone sound pious and religious yet be lost and stand condemned before God? How can believers bite and devour each other while regularly sitting under the faithful teaching and preaching of God's Word? These questions turn on the understanding that the special revelation of God's Word is not only revelation. A relationship with God isn't only knowledge based. Reading without belief and submission has little effect. The Pharisees "Search the scriptures...yet refuse to come to [Jesus] for eternal life" (v.40). Do you read the Bible to gain knowledge? Or are you being changed as the Holy Spirit applies God's Word to your life?

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 6:1-15

Today's passage is one of the most well-known stories in the Bible. E.W. Klink highlights for us a monumental truth—Jesus cares. "The grammatical emphasis placed on the 'lifting' of Jesus' eyes to see the large crowd coming towards him is a remarkable showing of the interest of God for humanity, even those for whom Jesus was merely a pawn in their own God-confused dreams. The narrative is careful to describe how Jesus was aware of the crowd's felt needs and was himself the source of provision. That alone is remarkable. Yet what is even more remarkable is not that Jesus could, but that he would...To say with the narrator that God loves the world (3:16) is not to speak into abstraction but to be on the other end of his eyes which he graciously lifted to see us."

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 6:16-21

The Old Testament speaks of God alone ruling over the seas. Jesus walking on the water was a powerful demonstration of His sovereignty over the world that He created. The fact that He did it in front of His disciples was not to amaze them but to be a visible demonstration of who He is, God.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 6:22-71

It is God the Father who "gives you the true bread from heaven" (v. 32). Bread from heaven is far superior to the manna that was given to Israel. Bread from heaven is eternal and spiritual in its nourishment. Manna only helps with physical needs and is temporal. Jesus is the Bread of Life, the true bread, the bread which we need for eternity.
