Thursday: Psalm 32

“Verses 1–5 are clearly one unit which deals with confession and forgiveness. The main point is in verses 1 and 2, namely, to be forgiven is a very happy condition.

Verses 3–5 tell us how to attain that happy state: first, negatively, don’t try to conceal your sin from God (verses 3 and 4), then, positively, acknowledge your sin and confess it to God (verse 5). So the point of verses 1–5 is: the person who does not conceal his sins but confesses them to God will find the tremendous happiness of a clean conscience and peace with God.” John Piper

Friday: Psalm 33

Today’s Psalm praises God (v. 1-3) who made all things, (v. 6 & 9) who rules all things for His purposes (v. 10-15), and reminds us our hope is in Him (v. 22). Take time to pray and praise the Lord and thank Him for His steadfast love.

Saturday: Prayer

Pray for the pastors serving in Nicaragua. Pray for courage, strength, and boldness as they faithfully proclaim God’s word. Pray also for their families. Pray that they, too, would be strengthened and cared for.

Monday: Psalm 29

The word ascribe is used three times in the first two verses of this Psalm. To ascribe is to attribute or give credit to something. Here the “heavenly beings” are called to ascribe “glory and strength” to the Lord that is “due his name.” Glory and strength are to be ascribed to the Lord because they are true of God, and He deserves admiration for them. As you meditate on this Psalm, think about how you can ascribe greater glory to God.

Tuesday: Psalm 30

Whatever “glory” David has is directly from and because of the Lord. “That my glory may sing your praise and not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks to you forever!” (v. 12). In this Psalm, we see David recognize that all he is and has is only because of God’s grace. Take time to acknowledge all that the Lord has done for you and has given you, which is all due to His unmerited grace.

Wednesday: Psalm 31

This Psalm of David speaks of taking refuge in the Lord. David also uses the word rock. Both rock and refuge are common ways of describing God. Psalm 73:1-3 uses similar language and also includes the word fortress. The believer knows that God is a rock, a fortress, and a refuge. Pray and thank the Lord for all the ways He has been these things to you.

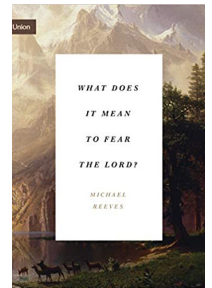
Sermon Application
