Thursday: Psalm 62

In this Psalm, David speaks of God as “my salvation,” “my rock,” “my fortress,” “my hope,” “my glory,” “my mighty rock,” and “my refuge.” Is God all of these things to you? Pray that you would see God as David sees God.

Friday: Psalm 63

God is praised through “joyful lips” (v. 5). God is praised because His “steadfast love is better than life” (v. 4). Take time to praise the Lord through joyful lips because of His steadfast love for you.

Saturday: Prayer

Continue to pray for the Standridge family in Italy. Pray for opportunities to serve the lost people and to show God’s saving love through Christ. Pray that the Lord uses them to accomplish His will.

Monday: Psalm 59

“Deliver me from my enemies, O my God; protect me from those who rise up against me; de-liver me from those who work evil, and save me from bloodthirsty men” (v. 1). This psalm, asking for protection to be delivered from enemies, is one that we need to take to heart. There are always those who do evil, who are bloodthirsty men. Whether now or later, our enemies will rise against us. Pray now and pray fervently for the Lord’s protection.

Tuesday: Psalm 60

“Verse 12. Through God we shall do valiantly. From God all power proceeds, and all we do well is done by divine operation; but still we, as soldiers of the great king, are to fight, and to fight valiantly too. Divine working is not an argument for human inaction, but rather is it the best excitement for courageous effort.” - Charles H. Spurgeon

Wednesday: Psalm 61

“David, in this psalm, as in many others, begins with a sad heart, but concludes with an air of pleasantness—begins with prayers and tears, but ends with songs of praise. Thus the soul, by being lifted up to God, returns to the enjoyment of itself. David, in this psalm, resolves to per-severe in his duty, encouraged thereto both by his experience and by his expectations.” – Matthew Henry

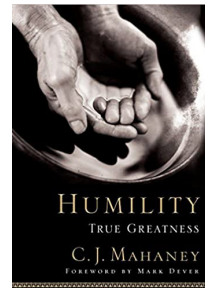
