*"We live in a messy world filled with messy relationships. The church exists in that world, so it isn't immune to messy relationships. The letter of Philemon is example A. The circumstances of this letter are just messy. Paul is a prisoner, writing a letter to Philemon—a slave master—about Philemon's thieving and runaway slave, Onesimus. And they are all Christians. Talk about a mess. The church is messy, and it doesn't get much messier than a slave and his owner in the same church. I tend to think this letter of Philemon resides in our Bibles because it offers one of the most complex, messy relationships the church could ever experience and provides a beautiful picture of how to seek reconciliation in the midst of such relationships."*
