

- 1. Preparatory to Christ
- 2. Difference is in *degree*, not substance
- 3. General spiritual blessings

Preparatory Works



- New Creation (Post-Fall) begins with Genesis 3:15
- There is nothing excellent among men... but it is ascribed to the Holy Spirit of God, as immediate operator and efficient cause of it.
- All preparatory to the work of the new creation in and by Christ

"The principal advantage of the present state above that which is past, next to the coming of Christ in the flesh, consists in the pouring out of the Holy Ghost upon the disciples of Christ in a larger manner than formerly." (John Owen, Works III.151)

 Teach me to do your will, for you are my God! Let your good Spirit lead me on level ground! (Psalm 143:10)


Guiding the believer

Prophecy - prepare for Christ

¹⁰ Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours searched and inquired carefully, ¹¹ inquiring what person or time the Spirit of Christ in them was indicating when he predicted the sufferings of Christ and the subsequent glories. 12 It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in the things that have now been announced to you through those who preached the good news to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven, things into which angels long to look. (1 Peter 1:9-12)

Prophecy – How God Works

Promise and Fulfillment

- Genesis 3:15
- Romans 15:8

In a sense, all prophecy is a confirmation of that promise

Prophecy – it began

At the very beginning

Adam needed revelation to worship

Even before the writing of the OT

- Enoch (Jude 14, 15)
- Abraham (Genesis 20:7)
- as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old, (Luke 1:70)

Prophecy – immediate effect

- Knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit. (2 Peter 1:20–21)
- Also Micah 3:8; 2 Samuel 23:2

Prophecy – immediate effect

- Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, "Today, if you hear his voice, (Hebrews 3:7)
- again he appoints a certain day, "Today,"
 saying through David so long afterward, in
 the words already quoted, "Today, if you hear
 his voice, do not harden your hearts."
 (Hebrews 4:7)

Prophecy

They departed after Paul had made one statement: "The Holy Spirit was right in saying to your fathers through Isaiah the prophet (Acts 28:25)

Voices


Ex. 33:11; Num. 12:8;1 Kings 19:12-18
