

Renegotiating Faith: Walking with young adults through a critical season in faith formation. The Evangelical Fellowship of Canada's recent research study "Renegotiating Faith: The Delay in Young Adult Identity Formation and What It Means for the Church in Canada" - will be the focus of an evening conversation at Redeemer University College (co-sponsored with CRC Faith Formation Ministries). The report's lead researcher and author, Rick Hiemstra, will present an overview of the report's findings and recommendations,

followed by a panel of experts moderated by FFM's Dr. Syd Hielema. The evening will provide a clearer understanding of young adult faith lives and suggest specific steps to take for congregations and families as they walk with young adults. The evening is support church intended to leaders, teachers, young adults parents. teenagers. Wednesday, March Redeemer, 7:30 - 9 pm. This event is free. The Annual Inter-Classis Safe Church Conference will be held on Saturday, March 2, 2019 from 9:00 - 3:30 at the Waterloo CRC. All are welcome! This year's special guest will be Bev Sterk from Lynden, Washington who spoke passionately at last year's synod about abuse and what the denomination needs to do to prevent it. Other speakers include Kathy Smith, adjunct professor of church polity at Calvin Seminary, Grand Rapids, and former crown attorney Henry Van Drunen. In addition there is a presentation on the "Circle of Grace" Abuse Prevention curriculum; a presentation on cyber-bullying by the Waterloo Regional Police Department and a session on detection and prevention of suicide.
