

This conference is an opportunity to come together with others from various denominations who share and understand this unique position. There is time set aside for workshops, worship, encouragement and reflection. **Pastor Amanda**, under the authority of our Council will be leading in a worship service at the retreat and serving Lord's Supper on Monday, May 13 in the afternoon. Classis Huron (a regional gathering of Christian Reformed congregations) meets this Wednesday (May 15) at the CRC in Clinton. The delegates from CCRC are Pastor Amanda (pastoral delegate and also serving as chair of the meeting), John D (elder delegate), and Jane V (deacon delegate). The agenda is relatively light with updates from various ministries including: the Fergus Church Plant: *The Bridge*; the Mission Catalyst position; as well as an update on River City Church, Cambridge, plans for organization from a church plant to a full-fledged congregation in the CRC. Classis will meet the new President of Redeemer University College, Dr. Robert J. Graham, for the first time. A larger item on the agenda will be the presentation of the 2018 Financial Statements by treasurer John Bell. The statements indicate that

CCRC paid 100% of our classical ministry shares and that Classis was able to pay all of its bills for the year. Pray for safety as the delegates travel from as far away as Owen Sound, Exeter and Cambridge and Acton, and that the Spirit of the Lord will lead the discussions. The meetings are open to the public.
