

Pete is married to Judy and they have three daughters and a son. Pete is a self-employed auto mechanic within the confines of Community #5. He is a long time member of Community CRC and has served on Council for four terms as an Elder. He was involved in the original pilot of the Community model at CCRC and has a pastoral heart and gifts well-suited to the office. Pete has also agreed to fill the vacancy for a year. It is our hope that his gifts can be well-used to build a stronger Community and equip people for future leadership.

Attention all Ministry Volunteers! A new building, new symbols, new policies... Are you aware of what is new and how it **impacts your ministry?** Disability awareness training, safe church policy training, and emergency and fire safety training is an annual requirement for volunteering at CCRC. Three duplicate dates have been set aside for such training (Monday, August 26, Thursday, September 5 and Monday, September 9). If you are an officebearer or volunteering in any of the ministries at CCRC you are asked to pick **one** of those three dates and come for an evening of awareness training in the areas mentioned. Highlights from the Administrative Council Meeting of July 23, 2019

- Welcomed Alesha H and Henry V as new Administrative Elders. Judy H will be ordained into office in August and welcomed at a future meeting. Also welcomed new Consistory liaison Nick B and Diaconate liaison Jeff F.
- Received and reviewed various staff and ministry reports and meeting minutes.
- Alyanne C and Dorothy V were both affirmed by congregation for nominees for Pastoral Elder in Community 2. Drawing of a name takes place on Sunday July 28.
- Pete H will be nominated to be Pastoral Elder for Community 5 on a 1-year interim basis subject to congregational affirmation.
- Staff and Community Review (SCR) Ad-Hoc Committee expects to have the congregational survey distributed to congregation in September and have the results available for use at the full office bearer retreat scheduled for November 23, 2019.
- The Pastors will develop an office schedule and submit it to Council for approval at August meeting.
- Received an initial report from the Montreal Mission Trip and possible next steps to take. The Mission Strategy Team will be working with the report and consider how it may be useful to our Communities in the future. Some funds have been approved to do a statistical analysis of our Communities
- Reviewed some of the necessary changes to the fringe landscaping of CCRC property due to the upcoming surrounding development and reconstruction of the Bleams Road/Fischer Hallman intersection.

- Jeff F and Marianne B are signing authority for Diaconate bank account.
- Roles and responsibilities were discussed for Administrative Council. Due to the number of elders unavailable for this meeting further assignments will be discussed at the August meeting. Chairperson will be Rob W and Clerk will be Alesha H.
- Retiring elders Andy d, Ed H, Harry O, and Agnes B (Diaconate Liaison) reflected briefly on their term and were thanked for their service.
