



This is our first Sunday in Phase 2 of CCRC's Reopening plan. Our current total capacity is 50 people worshipping within the church (in addition to the worship team), which follows the COVID policy approved by Council. This week we have invited worship volunteers and ushers to attend worship in person, and on August 9 we will be inviting elders and deacons. We will ordain and install new office bearers at that service on August 9.

Over the past week many of you participated in our congregational survey to estimate how many people from each community are interested in worshipping from our sanctuary. We're grateful for your participation! Based on the results of that survey we have been able to pair up communities so that we can invite two communities to each service. A schedule for August 16-September 20 is currently in process and will be shared with the congregation in the upcoming week.

Starting the week of August 16, we will be inviting specific communities to register for worship. A registration process is necessary in order to make sure we do not exceed our current capacity of 50 people. Our survey results have given us helpful estimates of how many people to expect, but registration will give the firm numbers. Registration will happen during the week leading up to Sunday. A link to register through an online platform called Eventbrite will be sent to specific communities early in the week. If there is still space available in the service by Friday, a link to register will be sent to the whole congregation in the weekly bulletin email. At that time, anyone from the congregation will be able to register to fill all of the available spaces.

Our services will continue to be live streamed, so those who are not comfortable returning or who are unable to return can continue to worship with us as we navigate this new stage of our life together.

 - Council will be reaching out to various ministries in the church to initiate conversation about what programs could look in the Covid era.
 - Council approved job description for *Pastor – Communities and Missions*.
