Disability awareness training (AODA), safe church awareness training and fire safety training are being made available for all volunteers in all ministries. There are two more opportunities for you to take the training - this Thursday, September 7 or next Wednesday, September 13. Council reminds you that if you are volunteering in any of the ministries of CCRC attendance is mandatory at one of the sessions. Please note that if you have already been through the AODA training at work or even here, it is required once again. The evening begins at 7 and ends at 8:30 p.m. Attendance will be taken. If you have any questions you can direct them to Council or to Pastor Carel.

For those living in the Region of Waterloo, Police Checks can now be applied for online at http://www.wrps.on.ca/ First click on "Online Services" and then "Online Record Checks." Kiosks are also available at the Cambridge, Kitchener and Waterloo divisions or you can still apply in person at the Police Reporting Centre located at 150 Maple Grove Road, Cambridge. The cost for volunteer checks remains at \$10 which is refundable from the Church Office (with receipt). Please note that if you apply online you will still need to pick up the Police Check. If you are a volunteer working with children or vulnerable adults please be sure to apply for the Police Vulnerable Sector Record Check. Once you have the Check, please put it in an envelope and hand bring it to the church office or put it in Pastor Carel's mailbox. If you are volunteering for one of the ministries of CCRC that involves children or vulnerable adults you are required to have a Check on file if you are over the age of 18. At CCRC the Checks are to be renewed every 5 years. Since it has been 5 years ago that this process really began in earnest quite a few of our volunteers will have to renew their checks in 2018.
