



Today is the second Sunday of Advent. Advent is that time of year when we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ at Christmas. This Advent season we are focusing our attention on the most frequently repeated command in the Bible: "Do not be afraid!" As we face an uncertain winter ahead, this command takes on particular relevance. It is also repeated throughout the usual Christmas stories — to Zechariah, to Mary, to Joseph, and to the shepherds when they see angelic messengers. We can relate to the deep fears of the characters in these stories: the fear of disappointment, the fear of having to revision our lives, the fear of a ruined reputation, and the fear of bad news. The angels' command, "Do not fear," is an invitation for us to take comfort in the providential care of God which is most visible to us through the baby in the manger, Jesus Christ.

We will continue with the registration process in order to make sure we do not exceed our capacity of 100.

Next week we will be celebrating the sacrament of Lord's Supper online and in our homes. The Council of Community CRC invites believers of all ages to the table, following an age and ability appropriate public profession of faith. If you desire to come to the table but have not made profession of faith, please let a pastor or elder know so we can begin the conversation.

Administrative Council has amended our COVID Guidelines so that Lord's Supper can be served in the sanctuary in a way that complies with Public Health guidelines for the safe distribution of materials. Communion will be served in individually sealed portions set out ahead of time by deacons and available for worshipers to pick up as they enter the sanctuary at a table overseen by an elder. When the time comes to partake in the elements, worshipers will remain in their seats, briefly remove their masks to eat and drink the elements, and promptly replace their masks. The Waterloo Region face-covering by-law provides an exemption for "consuming food/drink as part of a religious activity within a place of worship." Each person who partakes will be responsible to remove their cups from the sanctuary and deposit them in a recycling bin at the sanctuary exit. If you have trouble drinking from a small communion cup, large covered cups will be available upon request.

If you are attending worship but are uncomfortable removing your mask to partake you may pass on the elements and spiritually fast from the Lord's Supper, or take your elements home with you to partake later. No

stigma or assumptions will be made about those who do not desire to partake in-person during this time.

OFFERING SCHEDULE

There are two offerings taken on a weekly basis at Community CRC. The first offering is for the Ministries of Community CRC and the second offering is for various causes that our church supports. This week our offering is for Calvin University. Calvin University, formerly Calvin College, is an educational institution of the Christian Reformed Church and stands in the Reformed tradition of Protestantism. Calvin University equips students to think deeply, to act justly, and to live wholeheartedly as Christ's agents of renewal in the world.
