

Church at Home
Fifth Sunday of Eastertide | May 10, 2020

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, we have suspended our regular Sunday worship services and are encouraging people to worship together in their homes. This resource is intended to be flexible and adaptable for a variety of settings, depending on the gifts and resources available. It is structured after our regular worship service, but you may do what works for your context. Some sections have recommendations for worshipping in families with small children.

This service includes the sacrament of communion. Please take the time before you begin to prepare the elements you will be using to celebrate the sacrament.

Gathering & Greeting

<p>Call to Worship <i>(Psalm 28:6-7)</i></p> <p>Praise be to the Lord, for he has heard my cry for mercy. The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me.</p> <p>My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise him!</p> <p>The same God who calls us to worship greet us with these words:</p> <p>“Grace and peace to you, from God our Father, and the Lord, Jesus Christ.”</p> <p>Amen.</p>	<p><i>*For families with small children*</i></p> <p>We come to worship God today, because he has invited us to worship him.</p> <p>We worship God because we trust in him. He is our strength and our hope.</p> <p>Let’s sing to him!</p> <p><i>Families may light a candle as they begin Sunday worship as a visual reminder that worship is a special time when we rest in God’s presence in a special way.</i></p>

Confession & Assurance

Read John 14:1-14.

Prayer of Confession:

**Merciful Father,
we confess that you are
all we need.**

**You have shown us the way,
the truth, and the life.**

**You have brought us to yourself,
and we belong to you.**

**Forgive us when we
yearn for other ways, other truths,
other sources of life.
Bring us back to you.**

**Guide us, O Lord,
still our troubled hearts.**

We believe. Help our unbelief.

**Give us confidence in the joy of your salvation,
and prepare us for the dwelling place
you have prepared for us.**

Amen.

The prayer of confession may be followed by a time of silence, if desired.

Assurance of Pardon:

Read I Peter 2:2-10.

Hear the good news: In Jesus, the Rock of our Salvation, we are brought out of darkness and into light. In him we receive mercy, forgiveness, identity, and sustenance from his powerful hand!

Thanks be to God!

For families with small children

Read the story of the Last Supper from a children's Bible or a simplified translation (like the New International Reader's Version) and talk with your children about how Jesus feeds our faith with his grace at the Lord's Supper, the way that we feed our bodies at our regular supper.

Prayer:

Dear Jesus, you are our Solid Rock.

We can always count on you.

**Forgive us when we worry
and try to find safety in other things.**

**Help us to always trust in you,
especially when we are worried.**

Amen.

Families may talk about how baptism reminds us that God is always with us. When Jesus was baptized, the sky split open to heaven, and the Holy Spirit came down on Jesus. That's what God does in baptism. He rips open everything that separates us from him, and comes to live in our hearts. He promises to be with us always, even to the end of time!

If you’ve already memorized the Lord’s Prayer, start memorizing a Psalm together.</i></p> <p><i>Learn the “five-finger prayer.” Each finger represents a different group of people to hold up in prayer:</i></p> <p><i>the thumb - those closest to us</i> <i>the second finger - those who are far away</i> <i>the third - those who stand tall in leadership</i> <i>the fourth - those who are weak</i> <i>the pinky finger - ourselves</i></p> <p><i>Read more at https://network.crcna.org/prayer/five-finger-prayer</i></p>
