Building Notes:

- Face Coverings: After reviewing the state-wide mask order, we have decided to continue requiring the wearing of facial coverings by all adults during entering and exiting the building and while singing. We also recommend the wearing of facial coverings during the entirety of the service. The current statewide ordinance encourages masks for kids over six years old. We understand that this may be difficult for some kids, so we are leaving this up to each parent as to when to allow their own kids to remove their masks once they are seated. We would recommend kids over six to wear masks during entrance, exit, singing, and any other time they are not in their seats. This guidance will be reviewed as we have more information and direction from the governor or local officials.
- Nursing Mothers: We are now using the adjacent mothers' room for additional worship seating. There is still space for nursing mothers in the Nursery room on the Kids Hallway.
- The youth room is now (and again) serving as an overflow room. Additional seating is available in there, along with the service livestream.
- The Elementary Sunday School lesson, which is offered to K-5th graders during the sermon, will take place in a classroom or on the covered play area outside.
- We still have a "Wiggle Room" designated in the Kids Hallway for parents of younger kids who need a minute to calm down. You can find those to the left down the Kids Hallway.

The Acts of the Risen Lord: Whatever It Takes Acts 21:1-22:21

And now, behold, I am going to Jerusalem, constrained by the Spirit, not knowing what will happen to me there, ²³ except that the Holy Spirit testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and afflictions await me. ²⁴ But I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God. (Acts 20:22-24)

A Willingness to Suffer (21:1-16)

- Paul was determined to get to Jerusalem by Pentecost. (Acts 20:16, 22)
- But there was great resistance to that mission. (vv. 4, 11-12)
 - o Paul's brothers and sisters were told by the Spirit that Paul would suffer.
 - o They reasoned from the visions that Paul shouldn't go to Jerusalem.
- How do we reconcile their vision and Paul's decision?
 - o There is no evidence that they were mistaken in their visions.
 - There is no evidence that Paul was wrong for going.
 - o It seems that their vision (that Paul would suffer) was right and their conclusion (that Paul shouldn't go) was wrong.

Application:

Sometimes, opportunities for the gospel can only be seized by suffering.

I am in a strange land. No Christian friend, a large family, and nothing to supply their wants.... Well, I have God, and His Word is sure. (William Carey)

Mr. Dixon, you are advanced in years now and your own prospect is soon to be laid in the grave there to be eaten by worms. I confess to you if I can but live and die serving and honoring the Lord Jesus, it will make no difference to me whether I am eaten by cannibals or by worms. And in the great day, my resurrection body will arise as fair as yours in the likeness of our risen Redeemer. (John Paton)

o Always, a fellowship in suffering is helpful for gospel advance.

If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. (1 Corinthians 12:26)



A Willingness to Sacrifice (21:17-26)

- Paul was wrongly accused of being anti-Law.
 - Paul was against the idea that the Law should be imposed on Gentile believers.
 - Paul was not against voluntary observance of the Law and its customs.

Application:

We should not compromise on the gospel.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also <u>received</u>: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. (1 Corinthians 15:3-5)

We should demonstrate flexibility on many matters apart from the gospel.

To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. (1 Corinthians 9:22)

A Willingness to Sympathize (21:27-22:1-21)

- Paul was wrongly arrested in the Temple.
- Paul then testified as one who also persecuted the Way.

The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. (1 Timothy 1:15)

- Application:
 - We should remember that we were also once blind.

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. (2 Corinthians 4:6)

 We should remember that Jesus was without sin but had great sympathy for sinners.

When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. (Matthew 9:36)
