

It is always our desire to offer an in-person face-to-face learning experience for students in Preschool - 8th Grade. The following plan has been developed to guide decision-making for the best interest of our learning community.

*THE FOLLOWING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES WILL BE IMPLEMENTED FOR ALL 'ON CAMPUS' STAGES:*

- Three learning models available to K-8 students; Preschool meets on campus
- Heightened cleaning and disinfecting that includes daily checklists, electrostatic spray cleaning and the use of UV disinfection lamps as part of nightly cleaning practices
- Staff are expected to self-monitor their health (temperature & symptoms) and report symptoms consistent with COVID to their supervisor immediately
- Parents are expected to monitor student health daily at home prior to dropping children off at school
- Absenteeism is monitored and reported to administration daily
- Low threshold of illness - Any one of the following COVID symptoms is reason for a student/staff member to stay home:
  - *Fever (100.4 or higher), Chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, Diarrhea*
- Increased availability to hand sanitizing stations for students and staff
- Increased focus on proper hand-washing
- Sharing of materials is minimized
- All students must bring a lunch from home; In Red and Yellow, the entire campus is NUT-FREE
- School events, field trips, assemblies, and gatherings are carefully considered
- Touchless faucets are utilized in restrooms and classroom sinks
- Increased filter changes for HVAC systems
- The social and emotional health of students and staff is monitored and supported
- Spiritual care for students, parents, and staff is provided

**AZ Benchmark\*: MINIMAL**

- Parent choice of traditional walk-in or car loop procedures for arrival and dismissal
- Face Coverings optional for staff, students, and parents when on campus, unless mandated by local, county or state authorities AND deemed necessary for CG
- Chapel in Sanctuary/Theater in smaller groupings; Parents invited
- Specials are delivered to full classes
- Students work, play, and worship in larger groupings
- Lunch is held in the Life Center
- Limited outside visitors on campus (services for students per educational plan as space allows, parent volunteers welcome)
- In-person meetings are available to parents and campus visitors
- Full athletic program resumes as per AIA recommendations

**AZ Benchmark\*: MODERATE**

- Arrival and dismissal are by car loop only
- Student symptom checks conducted by staff during school day, if needed
- Face masks required for staff, K-8 students, and parents if mandated by local, county or state officials.
- Face masks optional for preschool students
- Use of movable hallway dividers to mark building zones
- Chapel live streamed to classrooms (one grade level attends live each week)
- Specials in small groups or virtually
- Students are able to be in grade level groupings throughout the day
- Middle School lockers are grouped by and used by grade level
- Limited outside visitors on campus (services for students per educational plan as space allows)
- Virtual meetings with administration and/or teacher
- Extended Care by reservation and drop-in, including Lunch Bunch
- Athletics can occur if mask wearing, social distancing, and cohorting can occur as per AIA recommendations



**AZ Benchmark\*: SUBSTANTIAL**

- Extended drop-off and pick-up times
- Arrival and dismissal are by car loop only
- Student symptom checks conducted by school staff at time of arrival, with possibility of a second check during school hours
- Face masks required for staff, K-8 students, and parents
- Face masks optional for preschool students
- Use of movable hallway dividers to mark building zones
- Chapel live streamed to classrooms
- Specials delivered virtually or in person with small groups of students
- Students remain in homeroom grouping throughout the day, including for lunch and recess
- Middle School lockers are not used
- No outside visitors on campus, including parent volunteers
- Virtual meetings with administration and/or teacher
- Extended Care by reservation only
- Athletics are suspended



**CONFIRMED CASE OF COVID-19**

In consultation with the Maricopa County Health Department, it may be determined that there is a possible exposure to students and/or staff. This may result in a short closure for a section of campus to clean, disinfect, and contract trace. All affected students in closed area participate in remote learning. Unaffected areas continue to operate under current stage adjustments.



**GOVERNMENT OR HEALTH DEPARTMENT MANDATED CAMPUS CLOSURE**

If the Maricopa County Health Department and/or state officials require campus to close, all students (Preschool-8th Grade) will pivot to remote learning.
