

Fun Summer Enrichment Activities

Book, Books, and more Books

Introduce a book by reading the title and illustrator and then have your child predict what they think the book will be about. Read to your child and ask them questions as you go to help strengthen their comprehension.

Memory Games: Make a memory game that reinforces skills such as letter identification, sound identification, number identification, etc. Start with just a few cards or paper plates and keep adding to them once your child masters the skills.

Fundations Chant: Have your child practice saying the chant. Ask your child, “What is the letter’s name and what is the letter’s sound?”. Have your child practice saying the chant in random order for extra practice.

Home Journals: Start a home journal. Have your child draw a picture of something during the day that they saw or did. Have them use their “Fundations Chant” to “stretch out words”. Have them label their picture and read it to you, pointing to each word as they read (one-to-one correspondence).

Opposite Game

Name a word and have your child think of the “opposite”.

I.e. hot/cold, up/down, inside/outside

Letter/ Number Hunts

Go on a letter hunt outside in your yard or inside your house.



Rhyming Games: Ask your child to try to find a word that rhymes with a word you choose. For example, you could say, “I’m thinking of a word that rhymes with *pen* that starts like “*h*”, and they say *hen*”.

Here are a few more examples....

*top/pop

*ham/Pam

*man/fan

Make a Book: Fold and staple papers together to make a book. Have your child illustrate pictures and label their pictures using their “Foundations Chart” and inventive spelling. Have your child read their book to the family. Have your child point to their words as they read. Remember to have them choose a title for their story. Have your child decorate a book box where they can house their special books.

Sight Word/ Letter Hunting in Books: Have your child look for letters and sight words in books. Count how many times they see the letter/sight word on a page.

Players: 2-6
Instructions: All players begin on the "Start" box at the bottom of the game.
Roll one die and move your token to the appropriate box. Read each word you move to on the page. If you don't read each word, you must go back to where you started and the next player takes their turn. If you don't know a word, what strategies can you use to figure it out? Discuss with other players for help. Each player must find their way to the "Finish" box on the top of the game by reading the words correctly. Avoid landing on the snakes head and sliding down and try to slide up by moving up the ladders.
Variation: When landing on a snake, players can put their words into a sentence as well as reading it.


