July Theme

We are excited to connect our VBS theme with our summer Sunday School lessons. All summer we'll be talking about how we can "Power Up" with the help of the Holy Spirit. When we do, our lives will show the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Each of these is something God does in us to change the world around us. We hope this video game theme will be fun for your kids . . . nostalgic for the Leaders . . . and a memorable way to explore how we can "raise our game" by following God!

July 7 – We start the month in James 1:17a. Jesus' brother, James, shares a bit of wisdom that reminds us how everything that's good comes from God. It's true! Everything good in our lives is because of God. And the best gift that God gives is Jesus. Because of what Jesus did for us, we can show God's goodness to others.

Bottom Line: Show God's goodness to others

July 14 – This week we discover how faithfulness shows up in an incredible moment that Luke records in Acts 12:1- 19. Peter faithfully served God and preached the message of Jesus. The church faithfully prayed for Peter while he was in prison. God was faithful to Peter and sent an angel to help him escape. They could hardly believe what happened, but everyone praised God for his faithfulness.

Bottom Line: Be faithful so others can count on you

July 21 – Next, we head to Mark 10:13-16 where Mark records a time when Jesus welcomed children, gave them His attention, and blessed them. Back then no one thought very highly of children, and what Jesus did would have shocked many who were watching. But Jesus taught that this is what the kingdom of God is all about, coming to God with the faith of a child.

Bottom Line: God can give you the strength to be gentle

July 28 – In James 3:3-10, we're reminded that our words have power. James uses practical images like a horse bit, a ship's rudder, and a flame to show us just how powerful they are. We can use words to encourage and help others, or we can use our words to hurt them.

Bottom Line: God gives you the power to have self-control

Our bible verse for the month is "The Fruit the Holy Spirit produces is love, joy and peace. It is being patient, kind and good. It is being faithful and gentle and having control of oneself." Galatians 5:22-23A,


Tapestry

“Celebrating the offering is a spiritual act of worship every believer can actively participate in each week. Giving becomes a celebration when the believer discovers the joy of generosity, which grows out of God’s grace.” — Melvin Amerson, *Celebrating the Offering*

We Give

To belong to our congregation is to be a steward. Some may say that “stewardship” is just a polite way of referring to financial giving to the church. But it’s far more than that.

One character in some of Jesus’ parables is the steward — the servant charged by the master to care for the master’s property. It is the master, not the steward, who owns the property, but the steward is responsible for it and is accountable to the master. So it is, said Jesus, between God and us. As God’s stewards we have three responsibilities:

- **Receiving:** We receive with joyful thanksgiving the many gifts that God showers upon us — time, talent, treasure, our bodies, our friendships, natural resources, and the beauty around us.
- **Managing:** We take good care of what we have received. We manage these resources wisely — for our own good and the good of others.
- **Giving:** Out of our gratitude in receiving so abundantly, we want to share with others. Let’s look at four kinds of gifts that we receive, manage, and share:

Our time

We did nothing to earn the hours, the days, the weeks of our lives. Time is a gift of God. How we choose to use it is a matter of stewardship. Some people lead lives of frenetic activity, always over-extending themselves to the point of exhaustion, while others sit around in apathetic boredom. Some spend all their hours serving the needs of others at the expense of their own, while others live only for themselves.

As Christian stewards we try to manage time wisely and in a balanced way. And we give our time gladly to family and friends, to strangers, to the community, the church, and to ourselves.

Our abilities

Do you remember Jesus’ parable of the three servants who received different amounts of money to manage while the master was away? We’ve each received from God distinctive gifts and talents. How we develop and use these talents is a matter of stewardship. Like two of the servants in Jesus’ story, we can invest them wisely — or like the third, out of fear we can hide them (Matthew 25:14-30).

As stewards, we acknowledge the gifts we have without apology. We develop them further, practicing new skills and putting our talents to work in ministry.

Our resources

We may think that our financial resources are our own. But when we recall that the time, the energy, the good health, and the opportunities for employment behind these dollars are all gifts from God, we see that the funds belong to God too. We are the stewards; God is the owner. So questions about what we earn, how we earn it, how we save, spend, and give it away, are all questions of Christian stewardship.

One vital aspect of our stewardship is our giving to Christ’s work in the world. We’ve learned that giving is most effective when we commit ourselves to give a definite proportion of our income through the church. For many, this proportion is one-tenth, or a tithe. Whatever the amount, we have discovered the joy in giving to God the “first fruits,” an amount “off the top” of our income, not what’s left over at the end of the month.

CONFERENCE REPORT

Annual Conference opened with a clergy session and a separate laity session. Speaker for the laity session was Rev Sue Nilson Kibbey of the West Ohio Conference's executive as Director of the office of Missional Church Development. Rev. Kibbey Spoke on Do you really believe that prayer makes a difference.

The opening Celebration was attended by approximately 2,000 people (both lay and clergy).representing around 890 churches of the Susquehanna Conference. Bishop Park's message was entitled, Made One with Each Other. His message emphasized the beauty and harmony inherent in the one-ness of our foundation in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

It was announced that Mission Central now has its own 501C3 status. This will enable them to receive donations from organizations outside the church.

The Spending Plan for the Conference was passed. The budget had no increase from last year (it was actually \$24 less than last year). It was also announced the conference apportionments would decrease by 2.07%. That does not mean that Chapel's apportionments will decrease.

Thursday evening was the Memorial Service for all members of conference that passed away during the last year. Rev. Brenda Leigey asked the question, What's Your Legacy?

Bill Leight was elected to General Conference on the seventh ballot. Twenty-five clergy retired with over 760 years of service in the ministry.

Rev. Brendan Hock was appointed from Chapel to Halifax.
Rev. Joshua Wargo was appointed from Rouzerville to Chapel.

The Ordination Service closed the 2019 Susquehanna Conference. The highlight of the Ordination Service is that Muriel, Diane, and I were present when Rev. Joshua Wargo was ordained.

The 2020 Susquehanna Annual Conference will be held May 28-30, 2020 at the Hershey Lodge.
