5-6 Year Old Sunday School

To find this room, turn left when entering the education wing, go through the double doors, and continue down the hallway. The room is tucked in the corner before turning towards the sanctuary. We are so excited about this class and look forward to seeing how the class progresses!

New Security Measures for our Nursery and Children's Areas:

In an effort to keep our children as safe as possible, the education wing will be locked during our Sunday School Hour beginning at 9:25 and will locked until the 10:30 service is over. There will be a doorbell available at the main education wing entrance (under the awning) for anyone who must enter this portion of the building during the secured times. There is also a doorbell at the entrance in the hallway from the main bldg. There is dedicated person inside the Ed Wing to let anyone and there will also be a roamer/greeter in the parking lot during these times. Thank you for your efforts to help us provide a safe environment for our children as they learn about Jesus and his great love for them!

Activity Bags Available for children ages 5-3rd grade during 10:30am worship

February Prayer Focus – REST

I love our Pennsylvania winter. Clean out closets (hmmm...maybe), binge watch old shows and movies (occasionally), loving the snow when it falls only on the grass (wishful) and definitely being a part of the God-ordained life cycle of rest and dormancy with building and storing energy needed for the days ahead. Read below for how the plants/bulbs handle this season.

Plant dormancy in winter doesn't mean that nothing is happening within the structures, it just means you don't see any growth above the ground. It is primarily a time of rest, but a few things are happening underground. Bulbs in winter need cold exposure as a necessary condition for them to form flowers. Dormant flower bulbs are experiencing a life cycle that promotes flowers and good foliage growth. Bulbs in winter need the cold exposure to eventually break dormancy bonds and force spring growth.

How can Chapel best use our time during this dormancy of our seasonal calendar? Accept this beautiful time in your life and in the life of the church to discover an unfamiliar book in the Bible, share your golden tidbits with another believer, be open to engage with those you interact with encouraging words and store your energy for when Christ calls you to be salt in the earth and a light to the world. Pray for "spiritual eyes" to be open during this time of self-reflection and finally, REST in the arms of the Good Shepherd as He cares for you in the chill, knowing that the next phase will be beautiful as you follow in His steps. And as you wait in dormancy, like the bulbs ,may "a few things be happening to you underground", my dear friends and fellow Chapel believers.

I am not sure if your church has a prayer network but we always value the prayers of our partners in ministry! If it is ok with you all, I will periodically send you some requests you can pray over and/or share with your prayer warriors. We appreciate you all so much and thank you again for your support in so many ways!

- 1. Thank you for your continued support in prayer! It means the world to us!
- 2. Praise God, 2 students have decided to trust in Jesus Christ in January!!!! We are planning to move ahead with baptisms and connecting them to a faith community!
- 3. Praise God, He is tearing down walls with some of our most at-risk and troubled students. They have opened up to us concerning struggles as they say they have finally come to see us as mentors and people that genuinely care. Pray for healing, restoration, and repentance in these lives!
- 4. Praise God, one of our girls had a baby boy in January! We thank God mom, dad, and baby are healthy! We also lift them in prayer as they navigate parenthood at such a young age. Pray for change in these students' lives and that the baby would be loved and nurtured in a healthy and stable household!
- 5. Pray as we continue to see students open up to us about their struggles, addictions, difficult situations, and past trauma. This year we are starting many new programs to begin to help address some of these issues in our community.
- 6. Pray for students dealing with various difficult home situations. Pray for parents who are dealing with the complexities of teenagers and difficult circumstances. Pray for the people selling drugs to our teenagers that they may come to know Jesus and repent. Pray for those who are hurting, dealing with thoughts of suicide, self harm, violence, abuse, addiction, sexual assault, self-worth, and so many issues that young people should not have to deal with.
- 7. Pray for peace in the Red Lion Schools and for those who use violence to resolve conflict. Pray they would meet Jesus and know his peace, that they would become peacemakers themselves.
- 8. Continue to pray for our teen peer-to-peer suicide prevention program, Hope Squad. We have connected 15+ students who were expressing serious thoughts of suicide to appropriate resources. While we rejoice in the success of the program and that students are getting help, it also reveals the great need and the severity of the current struggles in mental health.
- 9. Pray for financial support so that we can continue doing what God has called us to do and also continue to grow and offer more services to the struggling families in Red Lion.
- 10. Pray that God would send new volunteers who will come alongside the students and be models of who Jesus is, showing them love, compassion, mercy, and grace.
- 11. Pray for our discipleship group, our conversations with students concerning faith, and our connections to be strengthened with sponsoring churches. Our desire and goal is for students to come to know Jesus Christ. Pray for the many students who do not know Him, do not believe in Him, that they would seek Him with their whole hearts, that they would hear the Gospel and respond in faith, that Jesus' name, His power, and His love would be known and praised here in Red Lion among the young people!
