General Prayer Points

- Ask God to help you to slow down and to see opportunities to be a neighbor (Luke 10:25-37)
- Thank God that he has placed you wherever you live on purpose
- Pray for the needs of any neighbors that you already know
- Ask God for opportunities to build relationships within your neighborhood
- Walk in silence and listen for the Spirit to guide you in prayer





PRAYER WALKING

Taking our prayers to the very places where we desire to see God's presence manifested and our prayers answered. Prayer walking uses sights, sounds, smells, and even feels to engage both the mind and soul in prayer.







As you walk through your neighborhood, pay attention to what you see, hear, smell, and feel for possible hints about how to pray for and engage your neighbors. Some examples might be:

- Toys/bikes/school signs indicate children likely live there
- Lots of signs and decor might indicate willingness to meet other neighbors
- Do you frequently hear music from the home? Dogs barking?

These are just some examples. Be observant and prayerful!
