Key Truth: God's judgment paves the way for His peaceful reign with His people.

Introduction:

Q: What do you normally expect to result from judgment?

Micah 4:1-13: Come, Let Us Go Up to the Mountain of the Lord!:

"(Micah 4:1-5's) overall thrust is that God's gracious salvation of man has the last word, not his judgment on man's defeats. In this prophecy, more precisely, Jerusalem, which fell darkly under the rule of lawless judges and ecclesiastics, will not end as a heap of rubble, despised and trampled under the feet of uncircumcised armies, but will in the latter days be esteemed universally and eternally as the place of God's throne and the source of just laws that issue into peace."
