Key Truth: : God's law reveals that we must run to Christ alone to gain life and power over sin through the Holy Spirit.

Introduction:

Q: *How would you assess your view of God's law? How would you assess your obedience to God's law?*

Romans 7:7-12: The Power of Sin is the Law

“The relationship of law to sin is that the former is what gives the latter its power... That is, the law not only makes sin observable as sin, but also, and more significantly, demonstrates that one's actions are finally over against God, and thus leads to condemnation. The law, which is good, functions as the agent of sin because it either leads to pride of achievement, on the one hand, or reveals the depth of one's depravity and rebellion against God, on the other. In either case, it becomes death-dealing instead of life-giving.”

Gordon D. Fee, *Commentary on the First Epistle to the Corinthians*
