The Pilgrim Letters

Introduction

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One of the great challenges for Christians throughout history has been how to be in the world but not of the world (cf. John 17:15-21, 1 John 2:15-17). As Hebrews 13:14 describes it, "we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come." Yet, we are to be ambassadors of reconciliation in the context of and for the life of the world as Paul challenges in 2 Corinthians 5:16-21. This creates a serious tension for us. How do we not so remove ourselves from the world trying to escape its corrosive influence that we in effect put our light under a bushel eclipsing the glory of God in our lives displayed for the life of the world? On the other side, how do we engage with the various aspects of the world and not become entangled and corrupted by its passing fancies? Peter addresses this tension in his two letters to the elect pilgrims, a people who are on their way from exile in a fallen world to the greater Promised Land in the New Heavens and New Earth. Edmund Clowney describes the recipients of Peter's letters in this way: "In relation to their homeland, they are the Diaspora; in relation to their place of residence, they are aliens. They carry another passport.; they are on a pilgrimage to the city of God." We too are on this journey and live in this tension. We too would benefit from Peter's guidance in these letters.

Peter writes both letters to the scattered pilgrims throughout Asia Minor (mostly concentrated in modern day Turkey) who are beginning to endure growing hostility toward their faith in Christ.² Paul Gardner describes the specific context in this way: "As the churches of Asia Minor began to expand they faced great suffering and antagonism. Since this was already happening in part and undoubtedly would become more severe in the future, Peter wrote to encourage Christians to stand firm in their faith, and to witness to their Lord in the

pagan society in which God placed them."³ 1 Peter was most likely written between 62-63 A.D. with 2 Peter around 64 A.D. There has been a significant amount of scholarly debate about whether or not the letters were written by Peter. Both letters indicate that Peter is the author (or at least dictated the contents, possibly to Silvanus who delivered the letters according to 1 Peter 5:12) given the eyewitness testimony from the life of Christ. In addition, it has been accepted from the earliest church history that Peter authored both letters.⁴ His audience appears to be a mix of converted Jews and Gentiles for whom his main concern is "their lifestyle as resident aliens, and about their witness to those among whom they live…."⁵

In both letters, Peter seeks to shape the audience's identity as resident aliens by weaving together indicatives and imperatives. He calls for the exiled pilgrims to remember the indicative of "their present identity as God's people and their secure hope of ultimate blessing – both rooted in the death, resurrection, and victory of Christ." As Edmund Clowney writes, "Peter does not begin to exhort Christian pilgrims until he has celebrated the wonders of God's salvation in Jesus Christ. The indicative of what God had done for us (and in us) precedes the imperative of what we are called to do for him." This becomes critical as he focuses on how we should live in the midst of suffering in 1 Peter. As Clowney observes, "The sequence of our lives follows the sequence of Christ's life. He suffered first, then entered into his glory. So must we."8 It is also critical in his call to oppose false teachers and mockers in 2 Peter. Dick Lucas and Christopher Green summarize 2 Peter as "a homily on Christian growth, set in the context of threats to Christian stability from a type of destructive and heretical teaching (2:1-3) that is as common today as it was in apostolic times and that seems to hold out a perpetual attraction to some vigorous evangelical communities."9 Given that the people of God must continue to bear witness and live in a world hostile to the Gospel that will produce suffering, false teaching, and mocking, we too need to be reminded of who and whose we are and where all of history is truly going. May we find great comfort and challenge in these letters as we seek to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.



We will continue to seek nourishment from our historic faith and the Old and New Testaments for our weekly devotion and worship. The calls to worship will come from the Psalms as they so often give voice to and describe our experience as pilgrims who are in the world but not of the world. We will confess together each week a confession based on 1 Peter 2:9-12 which serves as the heart of Peter's purpose for writing to the elect pilgrims in exile. The assurances of pardon will come from various New Testament books that describe Peter's experiences of coming to know Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior as well as how he lived out the implications of this in a hostile world. Our benedictory blessings each week will come from 1 Peter 5:6-11 for 1 Peter and 2 Peter 3:17-18 for 2 Peter to help shape us further into a royal priesthood according to God's words through Peter. The goal of these various elements is to show us how we should live as those who are not fully at home in a fallen world who are assured of an exodus into the greater Promised Land in the New Heavens and New Earth at Christ's return.

This devotional is designed to encourage daily meditation and prayer in personal devotions and/or family worship. You are encouraged to use it the week prior to the associated sermon so that you and your family are prepared for worship. In addition to the Scriptures and associated questions, there are opportunities to pray for the various aspects of the Church. On Wednesdays, we will pray for the various missionaries, church plants, and missional ministries that we support at CCC as well as churches within the Northwest Georgia Presbytery. We also have the opportunity to pray on Saturday to prepare for a key aspect of the sermon or the appropriate sacrament. On Sunday, the Lord's Day Sabbath, the prayer will help to prepare us for worship in the presence of the Lord. Our desire is to continue to facilitate and grow in our dependence on the Lord through prayer.

May God bless our time in personal devotion, family worship, and corporate worship as we seek to for the Church to grow in the joy of salvation and unity in Christ for the sake of its mission in the world!



Monday, 9/3: Psalm 32: What are the benefits of repentance?

Tuesday, 9/4: John 16:32-33: Why is it important for us to know that Christ has overcome the world? What impact does this have on how we live?

Wednesday, 9/5: Pray for Joehann Guadulupe with Campus Outreach as he seeks to use his gifts for the spread of the Gospel at KSU.

Thursday, 9/6: 1 Deter 7:1–11: What gifts do you have that are benefitting or could be of benefit to the church and the mission of God? How are you using them at this time?

Friday, 9/14: 1 Peter 5:6-11: Praise God for placing a limit on how much suffering we will endure in this life.

Saturday, 9/15: Take time to read the preparatory letter and pray to prepare for the Lord's Supper. Give thanks for God's preservation of our souls in Christ despite our suffering.

Sunday, 9/16: The Lord's Day Sabbath with Bread and Cup: Pray for the means of grace to sustain us through times of testing and suffering.

The Week of September 23rd

Monday, 9/17: Psalm 23: Meditate on how the Lord has served as your shepherd. Give thanks for His presence in your life.

Tuesday, 9/18: John 21:15-19: What is the purpose of Peter's restoration? What is he to do?

Wednesday, 9/19: Pray for the Women's Extension and those who serve from CCC that God would give them grace and humility as they serve there in the name of the Good Shepherd.

Thursday, 9/20: 1 Peter 5:1-5: Who does God oppose? What are some ways that you are seeking to mortify pride in your life?

Friday, 9/21: 1 Peter 5:6-11: Give thanks for the ministry leaders that the Lord placed in your life to encourage you to be humble and sober minded.
