GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1) The theology of Prophet, Priest, and King is known as the munus triplex, the threefold office, and it was brought into prominence by John Calvin. Read the Westminster Larger Catechism question #45 and Shorter Catechism questions #23, 26. What do these questions and answers say about the work Jesus does for us in the office of a King?
- 2) Read *Deuteronomy 17:14-19*. As Moses prepared the nation of Israel to enter and conquer the Promised Land, he explained that God would eventually appoint a King over them. What were the four principles that were to guide the King that God appointed?
- 3) Read 2 Samuel 7:8-16; Psalm 89; 132. What is this covenant about that God made with David?
- 4) Read *Acts 15:14-16*. As King, Jesus subdues us to Himself. What does this say about Jesus subduing us to Himself?
- 5) Read *Isaiah 32:1-2; 33:22.* As King, Jesus rules and defends us. What does this passage say about Him ruling and defending us?
- 6) Read *Psalm 110.* As King, Jesus restrains and conquers all His and our enemies. What does *Psalm 110* say about this?
- 7) Read *Acts 2:29-36*. How does the resurrection of Jesus help us to know Jesus is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords?

FOR YOUR FAMILY

- 1) Memorize *Isaiah 33:22 "For the LORD is our judge, the LORD is our lawgiver, the LORD is our king; it is He who will save us."*
- 2) Read *Acts 2:29-36; Psalm 110*. Discuss with your family how and why Jesus, as King, is greater than David or any other King.
- 3) Read *Psalm 110*. Discuss how Jesus restrains and conquers all our enemies. Explain to your children what Jesus does as our King.
