

Christ Kids FAQ's

When will Christ Kids Elementary reopen?

On Sunday, August 8, 2021 we will open all of our Christ Kids environments.

- Kindergarten & Under
- Elementary (1st - 5th grade)

Do I need to register before bringing my children to Christ Kids?

No. You can check-in when you arrive. However, room spaces are limited, so if a room has reached maxed capacity we will ask your child to join you in the auditorium for worship.

What should I do if my child isn't feeling well?

Engage in Christ Church Online! If you or your child has any of the following symptoms, we ask that you enjoy service at home: cough, shortness of breath, chills, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, muscle pain, fever, runny nose, nausea or vomiting, fatigue, headache, and poor appetite.

Can I bring a diaper bag for my toddler?

We ask that families leave all personal belongings at home, but don't worry, our rooms are well-stocked with diapers, wipes, and training pants. If your child requires a special brand of diaper, please put the diaper of your choice in a large zip lock bag.

Can I bring a diaper bag for my baby?

For babies in the nursery, you may pack a premade bottle, pacifier on a clip, and an extra onesie in a storage bag.

Will you feed my child a snack?

Snacks will not be provided at this time.

I've never been to Christ Kids at Christ Church. Where do I go?

When you enter Christ Church, just follow the signs for Christ Kids Check-In. We'll be ready to greet you and direct you if you have any questions.

What steps are you taking to keep my child safe?

We're glad you asked! We are taking many steps to keep all of our kids and volunteers safe:

- Touchless check-in and check-out for our kids and parents
- Reduced capacity in all of our children's environments and smaller volunteer-to-child ratios
- We encourage sanitizing hands before entering the classroom
- Adherence to the CDC guidance for cleaning and disinfection of environments
