Right Doctrine in the Church

Proclamation Life Groups; Week of Sunday, February 14, 2021; Steve Thiel

Sermon Theme: The church is called to be a pillar for the truth. Therefore, false teachers must be refuted and gospel-centered teachers must train themselves and their people in good doctrine and in godly living to ensure their salvation.

I. Refuting False Teachers – Read 1 Timothy 4:1-5

- A. According to verses 1-2, where does false teaching come from? How is all false teaching ultimately related to the lies of the devil (deceitful spirits and the teachings of demons)?
- B. How do Jesus' words in Matthew 7:15-20 help you better understand the nature of false teachers? What connection does Jesus highlight between false teaching and false living?
- C. List false doctrines that are prevalent today in our culture and in some churches? In what ways do they deny the goodness of God or distort the Word of God?
- D. What do you think are the best ways to prepare yourself for identifying false teaching?

II. Affirm Gospel Teachers – Read 1 Timothy 4:6-16

- A. What are all the different ways that Paul commands Timothy to train himself in verses 6-10?
- B. Practically speaking, what different things can you do to train yourself in good doctrine? If you put together a weekly plan, what would be the top three things that you would do?
- C. According to Paul in verse 8, why should you value spiritual training over physical training?
- D. If you put together a weekly plan, what would be the top three things that you would do to train yourself in godliness? What part of that plan is individual and what part includes others?

III. Train for Eternal Life – Application

- A. What areas of life are covered in verse 12? In what area, do you need to grow the most?
- B. Read Psalm 119:9-11 and Romans 12:2. How do these passages help you understand the connection between good doctrine and godly living? What language does Paul use to communicate the importance of good doctrine and godliness?
- C. Why is it so hard to keep eternity in mind in your day-to-day life? When you're able to do so, how does it affect the urgency of pursuing godliness and telling others about Jesus Christ?
