SERMON DISCUSSION TIME: Have someone read the passage: Acts 20:17-38, and then read this sermon summary to jog everyone's memory:

The sermon by Pastor Mike focuses on Acts 20:17-38, revolving around the apostle Paul's final speech to the church elders in Ephesus. The sermon underlines three integral focal points for the health and future growth of the church, which include the church's mission to GO, GUARD, and GIVE. Within the church must GO section, Paul highlights evangelism and mission. He presses the importance of reaching out to those who are yet to embrace the word of God and the gospel, urging the church not to become self-centered. In the church must GUARD section, it's emphasized that the church should guard itself from internal and external crucial influences. Church leaders should pay keen attention to themselves and the flock, guiding and guarding the people with the Word of God and shielding them from false teachings. In the Church must GIVE section, Paul

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exhorts the elders in Ephesus to concentrate on stewardship and generosity. As the grace received through Jesus is liberating, Paul exhorts the elders to reciprocate with their own resources generously. This act of giving is in fact an act of worship to God, combating selfishness, and the love of money. Paul himself is taken as an example as he worked diligently to cater to other's needs and aid the weak. As the sermon concludes, Pastor Mike brings these three main points to us as Church at Bergen, emphasizing an outward and others-focused community which guards itself against harmful teachings and fosters a culture of generosity. He also emphasized the role of parents in securing future generations by leading a life of generosity and by looking for assistance in their areas of selfishness. The sermon is then brought home by reminding us of Christ's grace and sacrifice and how God's perfect generosity towards us should fuel our generosity with His Church and with others.

QUESTION \#1: Discuss the idea of generosity and giving in the context of the sermon. How does our attitude towards money impact our spiritual growth and the health of our church?

QUESTION \#2: Reflect on the statement, "Few things will choke out the blessing of God on a church and on your life than being selfish with your money. " What did/does this statement bring to your mind? What thoughts do you have after hearing that? What practical steps can we take to cultivate a generous heart and mindset?

QUESTION \#3: Share your personal experiences of witnessing the effects of grace in your own life and/or in other's lives when generosity and giving are practiced. How has generosity impacted your relationship with God and with others?

QUESTION \#4: Think about the statement, "It is better to lose your life than to waste it." How can we apply this principle in our daily lives as followers of Jesus? What sacrifices might we need to make in order to fully live out our faith?

QUESTION \#5: Discuss the significance of the phrase, "His wounds have paid my ransom." How does understanding and accepting God's grace through Jesus Christ impact our perspective on giving and generosity?

PRAY TOGETHER: Spend time taking and recording prayer requests and then pray together as a group. (You may want to consider sending out the prayer requests weekly to your group to keep everyone informed and in the loop on how to pray for one another throughout the week. This also makes it easier to check-in with people who have shared requests to see how the Lord has been working in their lives.)
