June 14, 2020 – Second Sunday after Pentecost

Season of the Cross: Green for Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time is the long season that takes up three quarters of the church year. This portion of Ordinary Time runs between Pentecost and Advent. Ordinary Time has traditionally been devoted to seeking our Lord in the simple, ordinary day-in and day-out rhythms of life. It is a time in which we are all invited to order our lives around Christ's life and teaching.

Call to Worship: Based on Isaiah 55:1-3

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us.

Leader: The Lord says, "Come, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

All: O Lord, help us realize that we can't buy that which only comes for free.

Leader: The Lord asks, "Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy?" He says, "Listen diligently to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food."

All: O Lord, we come this morning to listen diligently to you, rest in your grace, and delight in your love.

Songs of Adoration

We respond to God's invitation with songs of praise. These songs are designed to draw our attention to the wonder and glory of God.

All Things New

Reading of the Law: Proverbs 4:5-9

While the law cannot justify us or make us righteous; it is a teacher given to lead us to Christ, the fulfiller of the law.

Get wisdom; get insight; do not forget, and do not turn away from the words of my mouth. Do not forsake her, and she will keep you; love her, and she will guard you. The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom, and whatever you get, get insight. Prize her highly, and she will exalt you; she will honor you if you embrace her. She will place on your head a graceful garland; she will bestow on you a beautiful crown."

Prayer of Adoration and Confession

We pray together, praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

Assurance of Pardon: Colossians 1:9-14

We read God's Word together and are reminded that grace and mercy are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

A small portion of God's Word is explained to us and applied to our own lives.

12 I am the Teacher. I was king over Israel in Jerusalem. 13 I applied my mind to investigate and to explore by wisdom all that happens under heaven. It's an unhappy obsession that God has given to human beings. 14 When I observed all that happens under the sun, I realized that everything is pointless, a chasing after wind. 15 What's crooked can't be straightened; what isn't there can't be counted. 16 I said to myself, Look here, I have grown much wiser than any who ruled over Jerusalem before me. My mind has absorbed great wisdom and knowledge. 17 But when I set my mind to understand wisdom, and also to understand madness and folly, I realized that this too was just wind chasing. 18 Remember: In much wisdom is much aggravation; the more knowledge, the more pain.

Pg. 553 (Ecclesiastes 1:12-18 ESV)

13 I saw that wisdom is more beneficial than folly, as light is more beneficial than darkness. 14 The wise have eyes in their head, but fools walk around in darkness. But I also realized that the same fate happens to both of them. 15 So I thought to myself, What happens to the fool will also happen to me. So why have I been so very wise? I said to myself, This too is pointless. 16 There is no eternal memory of the wise any more than the foolish, because everyone is forgotten before long. How can the wise die just like the fool? 17 So I hated life, because the things that happen under the sun were troublesome to me. Definitely, everything is pointless—just wind chasing.

Pg. 554 (Ecclesiastes 2:13-17 ESV)

16 Don't be too righteous or too wise, or you may be dumbfounded. 17 Don't be too wicked and don't be a fool, or you may die before your time. 18 It's good that you take hold of one of these without letting go of the other because the one who fears God will go forth with both. 19 Wisdom makes a wise person stronger than ten rulers who are in a city.

Pg. 556 (Ecclesiastes 7:16-19 ESV)

16 Then I set my mind to know wisdom and to observe the business that happens on earth, even going without sleep day and night 17 I observed all the work of God—that no one can grasp what happens under the sun. Those who strive to know can't grasp it. Even the wise who are set on knowing are unable to grasp it.

Pg. 557 (Ecclesiastes 8:16-17 ESV)

Discussion Questions

1. Do you ever hate life? If so, what parts of life "under the sun" are most grievous (2:17) to you? Don't be afraid to be honest.
2. Does knowing stuff make you feel like you're in control of your life? But are you really?
3. If we are limited in what we can know, what should the character of our knowing be? Read James 3:13-18 and reflect together on what "wisdom from above" is like.
4. Why seek wisdom? What happiness comes from it?
