The Day of the Lord

- ***The day of the Lord is mentioned frequently in the OT*** (Isa 2:12, 13:6, 13:9; Jer 25:33; Ezek 7:10, 13:5, 30:3; Joel 1:15, 2:1, 2:11, 4:14; Amos 5:18 [2x], 5:20; Obad 1:15; Zeph 1:7, 1:14 [2x]; Mal 4:5).
- ***The day of the Lord is used in the NT as well*** (Acts 2:20; 1Cor 1:8, 5:5; 2 Cor 1:14; 1 Thess 5:2; 2 Thess 2:2; 2 Pet 3:10).
- ***The day of the Lord was used in the OT to describe _____ on the nations*** (Isa 13:9–11 and Zeph 1:14–16).
- ***The day of the Lord sometimes describes periods of judgment that have already occurred, but it frequently speaks of _____.***
- ***While the word “day” can be used to refer to one event, it also refers to a period of time—an _____.***
